EXPLANATION—The Power Index provides a direct comparison of the "elative strength of any two teams for this season to date. Thus, a 50.0 team has been 10 scoring points stron; r than a 40.0 team on their comparative records, in which scoring margin has been welghed against strength of opposition. This does not necessarily mean that a 50.0 team should defeat a 40.0 team by exactly 10 points in the uture. Teams rarely follow past performance that closely. Furthermore, the ratings are not adjusted for such factors as hope court, injuries and ineligibilities. The Dunkel system correlates records of all college teams and was started in 1929.


