R. H. Muscott Dies at Dallas

Dallas, March 4—Robert Henry Muscott, 55, well known here, collapsed on the street about 11 a. m. Friday and died a few minutes later at the Dallas hospital where he was taken by ambulance.

Muscott was born in Dallas April 6, 1895, son of Henry E. and Molly Muscott. He served in World War I, first as a member of Dallas Company L of the 162nd infantry. He enlisted at Clackamas June 25, 1917 and served overseas until March 24, 1919.

He had been in ill health with heart trouble for some time and spent most of last summer in Veterans hospital of Portland.
