



### Exams Offered Census Takers

More than 500 applicants for census takers will take examinations for enumerators in the Salem district later in the week with 280 to be hired, according to Cornelius Bateson, district supervisor.

Final crew leaders have been selected, Audrey Kessler, Corvallis, for Benton county; James M. Howes, Newport, Lincoln county and Harry W. Chambers, Newport, for parts of both counties. The examinations will be given by crew leaders who will

also give short appraisals to applicants. A minimum specified score is required.

Some selectivity has been required in Salem and other parts of Marion county because of the numerous applicants. Bateson states. Tests will be given nearly twice the number to be employed.

Tests will be held in Salem Thursday and Friday at the senior high and Bush schools and Saturday in schools or other public buildings in Woodburn, Mt. Angel, Dallas, Independence, west side Salem, Canby, Aumsville, Stayton, Milwaukie, Oregon City, Newport, Taft and Corvallis.

Brisbane, Australia, March 7 (AP)—A Royal Australian air force Lincoln bomber crashed in flames in southeast Queensland today, killing four persons aboard. The plane smashed nose first into a field at Rosewood near Ipswich.

### Death Threat By Gangsters

Los Angeles, March 7 (AP)—A top federal enforcement official disclosed Tuesday that he received a death threat in connection with the government's intensive drive against narcotics rings and gang warfare in California.

George White, head of the federal narcotics bureau in the western region, told a reporter he received a telephone call just after Abraham Davidian, a key government witness, was slain in Fresno last Wednesday. A voice said:

"Here is a friendly tip. Davidian was first. You're next."

White said such threats are not unusual and that he discounts it.

A federal grand jury, called in special session, was to begin an investigation of the narcotics and gang war problems late today. In the meantime James Robert Iannone, 38-year-old minor hoodlum who bolted the Mickey Cohen mob, is booked on suspicion of murder in the slaying of Davidian.

Iannone a one-time boxer, is wanted for questioning by Fresno, Calif., police in the slaying there last Wednesday of Abe Davidian.

Davidian was to have been the government's key witness in the trial of 14 men charged with narcotics conspiracy.

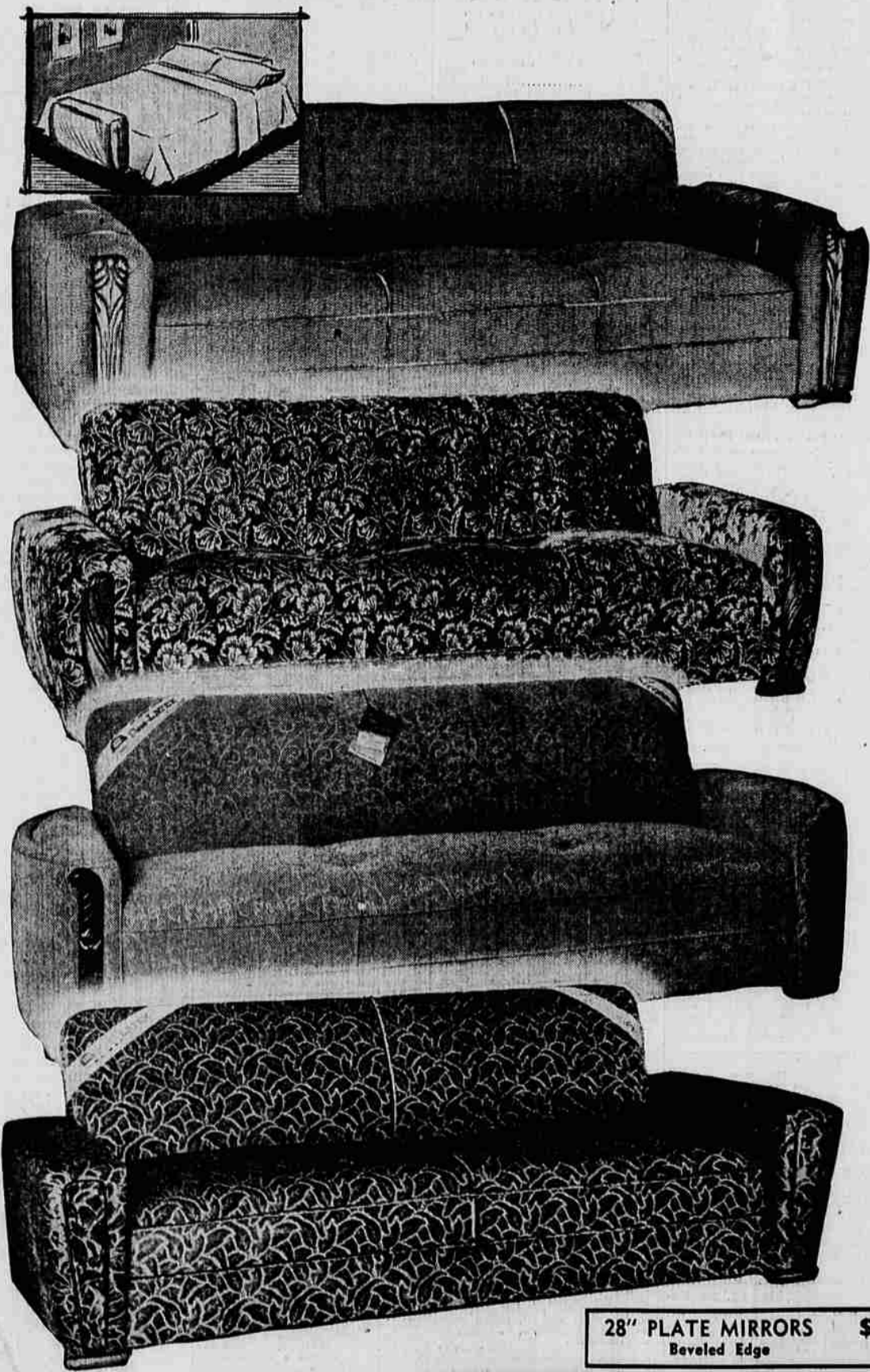
