Commies Lose Phone Battle

Berlin, April 13 (AP)—The communists lost round three in the battle of the telephones Wednesday.

Round one started weeks ago when the American radio RIAS set up an system whereby any subscriber could dial "23" even in the Soviet sector—and his telephone was connected with a western news broadcast.

Soviet sector engineers blocked off miles of lines, removed some telephones entirely from circulation and finally managed to break the link.

RIAS and the West Berlin

telephone network then developed a new number "2-4000" which automatically pipes the broadcasts into communist territory. Officials said today the East sector would just about have to shut off all connections with West Berlin to destroy the effectiveness of the new number. The only alternative, they said, is for the East to rearrange its entire network, a six-months' job.

50 Killed in Wreck

New Delhi, India, April 13 (AP)—Fifty persons were reported killed today when a passenger train jumped the track and crashed into a stream 45 miles south of Bareilly in Uttarpradesh.

Seventy-three were said to have been injured.

SUPPORT FOR McCARTHY

Taft Attacks 'Libeling' so As to Whitewash Charges

Washington, April 13 (AP)—Sen. Robert A. Taft (R., O.), said today that President Truman is "libeling" Sen. Joseph R. McCarthy in an effort to whitewash the Wisconsin republican's charges against the state department.

Taft also accused democratic members of a senate foreign relations subcommittee of making "no real effort" to determine the truth of McCarthy's statement that communists have infiltrated the state department.

On the contrary, Taft said, "they have tended to try Senator McCarthy."

The statement — Taft's most outspoken public comment in the case — was contained in his weekly column to some Ohio newspapers.

The subcommittee has subpoenaed ex-communist editor Louis Budenz to testify on April 20. McCarthy has stated that Budenz will testify that Owen Lattimore, noted far eastern expert, was a communist subject to the party's discipline.

McCarthy has also accused the Johns Hopkins professor of being Russia's top espionage agent in this country. Lattimore has denied all of McCarthy's charges under oath.

At next week's meeting, Lattimore will be given the opportunity to reply immediately to Budenz' testimony if he so desires.

In his column, Taft made no effort to associate himself or the GOP with McCarthy's charges against specific individuals. But he said there has been a pro-communist influence within the department which merits "a sincere investigation."

"Whether Senator McCarthy has legal evidence, whether he has overstated or understated his case is of lesser importance," he said. "The question is whether the communist influence in the state department still exists."

"Every member of the administration ought to be eager to have that question determined finally and conclusively. The president above all, instead of libeling Senator McCarthy and prejudicing the entire case, should be anxious—if he can do so—to eliminate any suspicion of treason from his own departments."

Squirrel Poison Again Available

Poison grain for the control of squirrels will again be available this year through the county extension office in the courthouse at Dallas, according to county extension agent N. John Hansen.

Hansen stated that for a number of years squirrel poison has not been handled through the office due to difficulties in handling, the price situation, and that there were other materials available.

Squirrel poison is being mixed this week by extension agents in surrounding counties at Salem, and will be ready for distribution about the 15th of April.

Hansen is arranging for other places of distribution in various sections of the county for the convenience of farm people wishing to secure this poison grain.

The squirrels are quite numerous this year and it is important to control them as much as possible, as they do considerable damage to crops.

The price of the poison grain will be 50 cents for a 3-pound bag, which is sufficient to cover quite a large area for poisoning squirrels.

Ingrid to Settle Out of Court?

Hollywood, April 13 (AP)—Actress Ingrid Bergman and her husband, Dr. Peter Lindstrom, may settle out of court their bitter feud over custody of their 12-year-old daughter, Pia, and their property. Attorney Isaac Pacht indicated today.

"We are getting together on an arrangement that will be satisfactory to all parties concerned," Pacht said as a hearing to take a deposition from Dr. Lindstrom was postponed from today until Friday.

He indicated attorneys hope to settle the controversy by Saturday, when Lindstrom is due to answer a suit brought by Miss Bergman for custody of Pia and an accounting of their community property.

Lindstrom has failed to recognize a Mexican divorce she got in February a week after she gave birth Feb. 2 in Rome to a son fathered by Italian film Director Roberto Rossellini.

The Hollywood doctor announced he would bring his own divorce action in California to gain custody of Pia after the actress' suit was filed here. But he delayed filing his action as attorneys sought an out of court agreement.

Mother of 10 Children Killed by Son-in-Law

Brighton, Colo., April 13 (AP)—A 34-year-old mother of 10 children was shot to death by her son-in-law who then committed suicide by gulping a disinfectant fluid, authorities said today.

Manuel Aguilar, 48, of Denver, shot and killed Mrs. Caroline Candelarie of Bar Lake, Colo., Tuesday night because he blamed her for divorce proceedings filed against him by his wife, Sheriff Homer Mayberry believed.

Aguilar died an hour after the shooting from drinking a large dose of disinfectant.

Inmates of the Adams county jail reported that Aguilar had made threats against his 17-year-old wife, Barbara, last

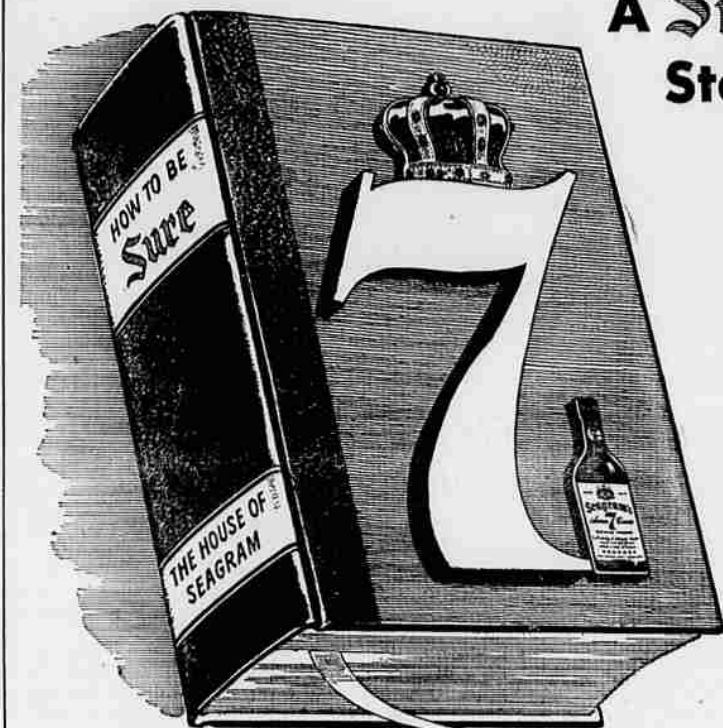
week while he was held on a disturbance charge. They said, however, that he had not complained about his mother-in-law.

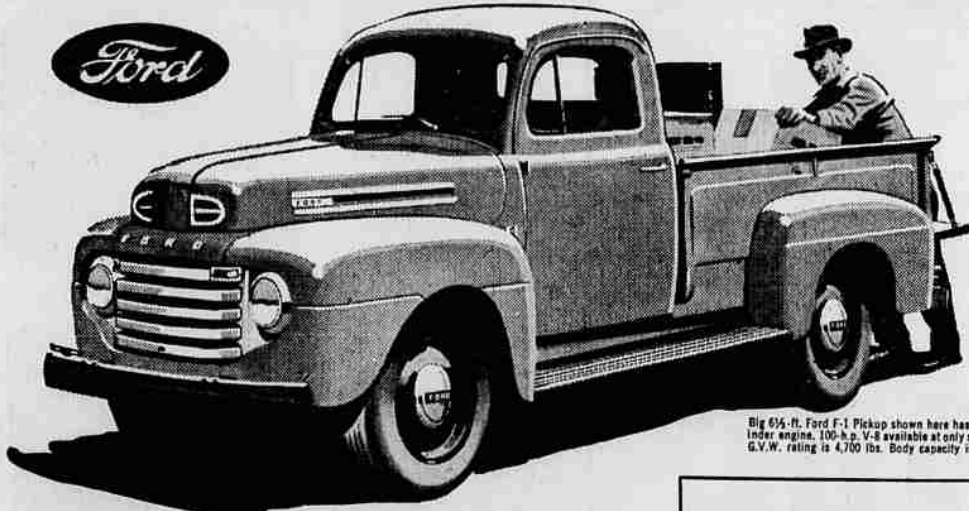
