

Speech by Dr. Dubach Ends Young Legislators' Session

Dr. U. G. Dubach delivered the final words of the third annual YMCA Youth Legislature Saturday afternoon as he told the value of the session here.

Boy Governor Wayne Carothers of Klamath Falls signed seven bills Saturday afternoon and vetoed a pair of bills which passed both houses and were sent to him. Lack of time of the model legislature prevented overriding the veto by a two-thirds vote of both houses.

The 1950 Youth and Government session enacted laws to increase jurisdiction of the small claims department of justice courts; prevent discrimination because of race or religion in places of public accommodation; for a referendum on proposal for \$1000 annual salary for state legislators; to set a minimum salary for school teachers; prevent discrimination against women in employment; legalize inter-marriage of whites and Negroes and Mongolians; and permit sale of colored oleomargarine.

One veto was on a senate bill which would have provided money from the state general fund for distressed school districts which the "governor" said "is basically good . . . but our budget at the present time is such that we cannot afford such a measure as proposed."

A senate bill introduced by Harrison Elliott Hi-Y club of Salem, providing for vocational rehabilitation and employment of all qualified persons in state penal institutions was vetoed because "the basic idea behind the bill is fine, but there is no statement or limitation to the

London Dockers Return to Jobs

London, May 1 (AP)—The huge London harbor hummed with full life today for the first time in nearly two weeks as 14,000 dockworkers streamed back to work after a crippling, wildcat strike crushed by the government.

Food came pouring off idle ships and valuable dollar-earning cargoes were loaded.

The strike denounced by the government as communist inspired, began April 19 in protest against the expulsion of three men from the Transport and General Workers union for leading a similar walkout last summer. That strike also had been branded by the labor government as a communist plot.

The government moved in troops to handle the strike-bound vessels and smashed the walkout by approving a threat to fire any docker who didn't return to work by today.

The strikers voted to return to their jobs in various mass meetings beginning last Friday.

In comparison with previous legislatures of the YMCA the debate was stymied because of the considerable "log rolling" this year.

An amendment that all laws passed in the YMCA Youth Legislatures be put into a book was introduced by the Journalism committee and is now under consideration by the state-wide committee for next year.

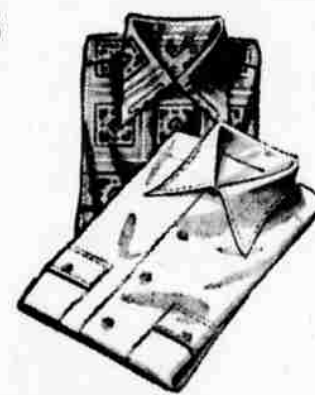
