Unionvale first and second grade students with the teacher, Mrs. Charles A. Ferguson, held an all day picnic at the McMinnville city park Thursday.

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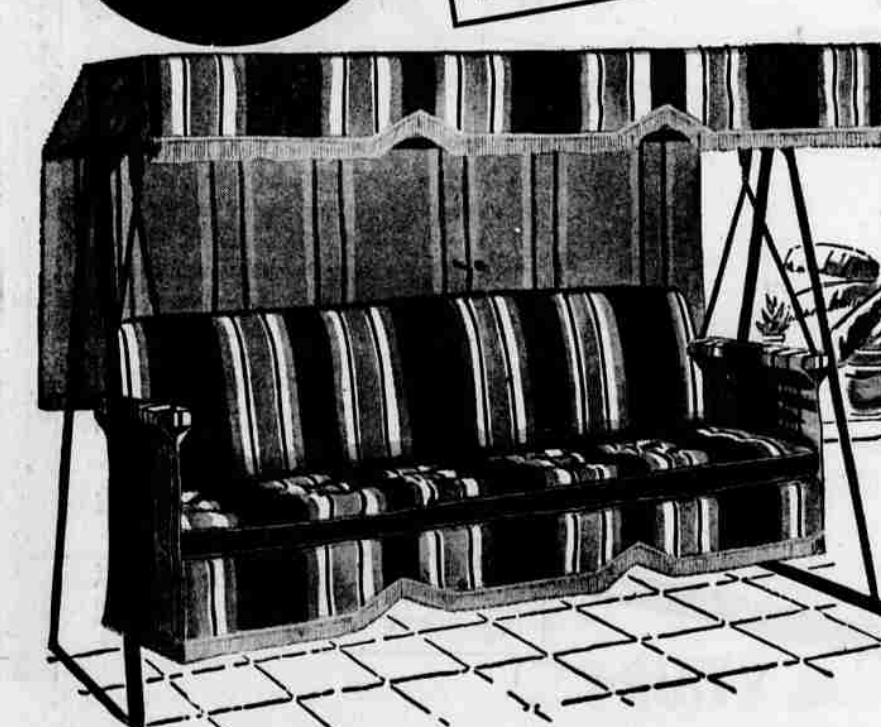
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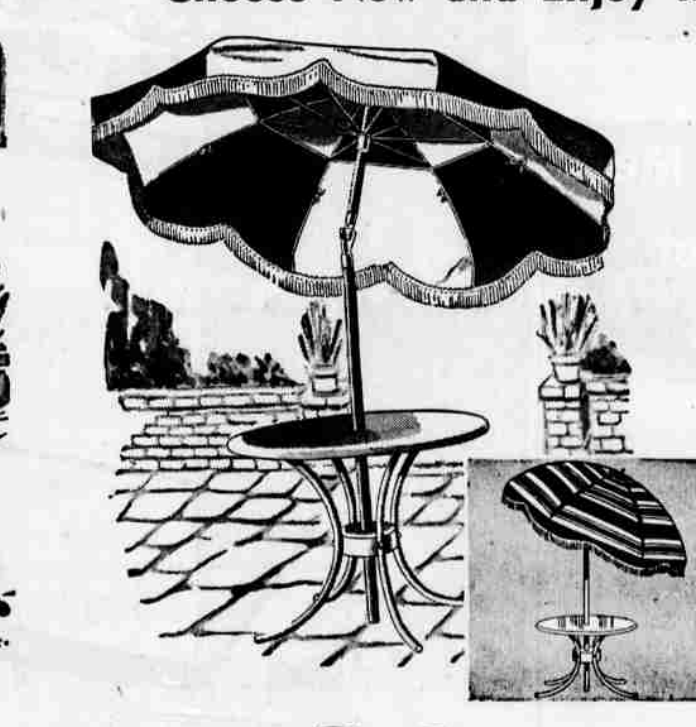
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
