Weapon Can Destroy Supersonic Plane

New Orleans, June 13 (U.P.)—Brig. Gen. John Weckerling, chief of the Louisiana military district, said here today the U.S. has a guided missile capable of destroying an airplane flying at supersonic speed.

Weckerling spoke to 600 officers and men of the organized reserve corps at the opening of a two-week training period. He did not elaborate on the hitherto-unaccounted weapon.

In addition to the guided missile, he said, "our tanks and anti-aircraft equipment are the best in the world, although we do not have many of the newest types in actual being."
