### Norblad Favors Year-Around, Full-time Job for Congressmen

Put congress on a year-round, full-time basis and stop the wanton and reckless waste of millions of dollars that results from jamming through the closing hours of each session of much unworkable and dangerous legislation. That's the recommendation made in a July American Magazine article by Rep. Walter Norblad (R., Ore.).

This 42-year-old war veteran, now serving his second term in the house, admits to sitting "bug-eyed watching the billions go by" as temper-frayed sleepy-eyed lawmakers jammed bills appropriating billions and other legislation favored by certain blocs through the final hours of one congress. "Year after year, in the closing weeks, congressmen vote for important bills they know virtually nothing about," says Norblad who recommends:

A year-round session of congress with a two-month recess during the hottest weeks of summer and shorter recesses of perhaps three weeks in the spring and fall.

"This," he explains, "would not only give us periodical contact with our constituents but ample time, in election years, to campaign for renomination and re-election."

Since this is an election year, congressional leaders are hopeful of a July 31 adjustment so the next few weeks will likely see a repetition of the log-rolling, and last-minute deals to put across pet bills, about which the Oregon republican complains in his signed article.
