\$110 Millions in U. S. Weapons Left in S. Korea Last Year

Washington, July 6 (AP)—The United States turned over \$110,000,000 worth of anti-tank weapons, artillery and other equipment to South Korean forces when the American occupation troops left a year ago, it was disclosed today.

Presumably this equipment, said to be sufficient for 50,000 men, was available to the South Koreans when the North Korean communists invaded the south.

A confidential report prepared by the staff of the house foreign affairs committee revealed that the equipment had been given the military forces of the South Korean republic. The report was labeled "background information on Korea."

Some republican congressmen and Korean leaders have maintained that U. S. arms aid was "too little and too late."

The equipment turned over by U. S. troops included more than 100,000 rifles and other small arms; more than 2,000 anti-tank bazookas with 40,000 rounds of ammunition; more than 4,000 vehicles and "a large number" of 37- and 57-mm anti-tank

guns, 105-mm howitzers, 80 and 80-mm mortars, with more than 700,000 rounds of ammunition for these weapons.

The American troops also turned over 40,000 Japanese rifles with ammunition.

The report said that 70 vessels, including mine sweepers, landing craft and picket boats were given to the Koreans along with about \$150,000 worth of spare parts.

American occupation forces were withdrawn from Korea in July, 1949.

Acheson Labels Russian Claims on Korea 'False'

Washington, July 6 (AP)—Secretary of State Dean Acheson said Wednesday that Russia's charge that South Korea started the war was just as false as Nazi Germany's claim that Poland started World War II.

Acheson told a news conference that the world will not be fooled by communist attempts to blame South Korea.

No Presidential Talk on Korea

Washington, July 6 (AP)—The White House said today President Truman has no intention of addressing congress or the nation on the Korean war at present.

Presidential Secretary Charles G. Ross said the question of whether Mr. Truman should appear before congress as some members have urged, was among those discussed at a secret Blair House meeting Monday afternoon.

Ross said no final decision was made and added: "The President has no present intention of going before congress or making a radio speech to the country."

Ross said he could not speculate on what developments might occur later which would change the situation, but indicated it was safe to assume there would be no speech this week.

He told newsmen the Blair House conference was for a "general review" of the situation.

He said there was no advance announcement of it because it was supposed to be confidential. Word of the meeting leaked out, however.

Ross said the President was likely to call in people "at any time" to discuss the Korean situation.

West German Security Called Essential

Frankfurt, Germany, July 6 (AP)—U. S. High Commissioner John J. McCloy said last night that Western powers would consider an attack on West Germany an attack on themselves.

For that reason, he said, West Germany needs no formal security guarantee.

West German Chancellor Konrad Adenauer pressed the high commissioners again over the week-end for a security guarantee.

"Briefly, it could be said that the security of Germany is in the same general category as the security of the Western powers," McCloy replied.

"3. The Security Council of the United Nations acted in support of the Republic of Korea only after it was satisfied that

this was a case of utterly unprovoked aggression.

"4. Any contention that hostilities were started by the Republic of Korea is clearly in the category of the Nazi claims of 1939 that Poland started hostilities by attacking Nazi Germany."
