

Mrs. Walling, Life-Long Resident of Valley, Dies

Mrs. Jesse D. Walling, a life-long resident of this section of the valley, died early Sunday morning at a local convalescent home at the age of 87 years following an illness of several months.

Bids on Timber At High Mark

The state forestry department held a timber auction today, and got three to five times as much money as it expected. The department said this is an indication that timber prices will rise even more.

The Scordrite company of Portland was the successful bidder on the two tracts of timber.

The company bid \$33,500 for 1,600,000 feet of Douglas fir located five miles northeast of Mahama in eastern Marion county. The department had expected about \$15,000.

The Scordrite company also was the successful bidder for between 8,000,000 and 12,000,000 feet of timber on 7,000 acres of logged-over land in the Rock Creek area near Mill City, also in eastern Marion county.

The company bid \$27.25 a thousand feet for Douglas fir, while the forestry department had expected a price of only \$5 a thousand. It bid \$10 a thousand for the hemlock, \$10 for cedar, and \$15 for Noble fir.

There were 12 bidders for each timber sale.

Gyves Snap on As Man Sleeps

An ex-convict who broke out of Polk county jail at Dallas early Friday was handcuffed Sunday while he slept at his mother's home—near Oregon State prison, and just three blocks from the headquarters of state police who arrested him.

Harry William Detillion, 26, told the officers he had walked past state police headquarters earlier Sunday after a two-day cross-country trip from Dallas through hop fields and berry patches. Officers said he looked "pretty tired and hungry."

Detillion was being held at Dallas on charges of stealing an auto in West Salem. He escaped by removing cell bars with a wrench and sliding down an improvised rope made of blankets.

Sheriff Tom Hooker reported that Detillion claims he made a wrench while confined and removed the bolts from the steel window casing, but Hooker states that he doubts the statement for the bolts are large and quite solidly set into the casing.

Escape from the jail carries with it a mandatory sentence of one year in the county jail, but Hooker said that Detillion will probably face only the grand larceny charge upon which he was originally apprehended.

Detillion was first received at Oregon state prison from Douglas county in 1940, sentenced to 1½ years for burning with intent at insurance fraud.

He was sentenced again from Marion county February 14, 1944, for burglary and larceny and sentenced to three years. He was released December 17, 1945, on parole but returned to the prison February 8, 1946. He escaped May 20, 1946, but was caught the next day. He was last released from Oregon State prison December 22, 1947.

Call Urgent to Active Duty

Fourth air force this week issued an urgent call for airmen reservists and non-reserve veterans experienced in technical specialties to volunteer for immediate return to active duty.

According to the release 4500 reserve officers have volunteered but response from greatly needed airmen specialists has lagged. Of those reservists volunteering only certain specialists are being recalled at this time and to date no reservists have been recalled to active duty involuntarily.

Those airmen of reserve status applying for active duty will be recalled at the grade held in the reserve. Non-reserve veterans volunteering will be accepted at the grade held at the time of discharge. Former reservists can re-enter the air force at the highest grade held while associated with the reserve.

Minimum term of voluntary duty will be one year subject to earlier release should conditions permit.

Following is a partial list of those fields in which men are particularly needed: Intelligence, weather, all phases of communications and electronics, armament, aircraft maintenance, metal workers, construction, supply, fire fighting, medical, dental and all air crew positions.

Orders Follow Service Need

Orders are to be issued to those Naval Reserve officers, who have volunteered their services, as billets become available.

That word was sent to the commandant of the 13th naval district by the navy department and forwarded to the Capital Journal Monday.

In the communique it was stated, "Orders will be issued in accordance with the needs of the service and the individual officer's qualifications."

It was pointed out further that due to the work load incident to processing voluntary requests for return to active duty the Navy department is unable to acknowledge receipt of requests. It also cannot answer inquiries as to the status of each applicant or the availability of billets.

In every instance provision will be made for a delay of 10 days from the time orders for active duty are received to the date of reporting for duty.
