## Radars Not Working on Luckenbach at Collision

San Francisco, Aug. 29 (P)—A witness told a Coast Guard board of inquiry today the freighter Mary Luckenbach's radar was not working when it collided last Friday with the navy hospital ship Benevolence off the Golden Gate.

Martin E. Dayton, mate of the freighter, was the first witness called at the hearing opened.

Dayton testified the freighter's direction finder was working, but the ship's radar was not. He said a repairman had worked on the radar while the freighter was in dock, but added it was

his "understanding" that the radar still needed some adjustments.

Dayton testified as the navy was holding another hearing on Yerba Buena Island in San Francisco bay. This hearing was closed to the public.

Dayton estimated the collision with the hospital ship occurred at 5:02 p.m., with fog limiting visibility at the time to only 1,000 feet.

"The Mary Luckenbach required no assistance," Dayton testified. "The first indication I had that the Benevolence was in serious difficulty was an hour and a half later when we heard yelling over our starboard bow."

"We started to lower a boat and got it almost to the water when a Coast Guard launch came alongside with some survivors. We took aboard the survivors, then put a crew in a lifeboat and sent it out in the general direction where all the hollering was taking place."

Lt. Cmdr. Frederick A. Reicker, a member and reporter for the Coast Guard board of inquiry, asked: "When were you first aware your vessel was in trouble?"

"When I heard the danger signal—four blasts by the Mary's whistle," Dayton replied. "I was in the after part of the midship house. A few seconds later we heard a siren ahead of us. I recognized that as the navy signal for a collision."

"The impact of the collision came just seconds after that."

Also, the need for expanding volunteer services was discussed. Mrs. Earl Snell, chairman of volunteer services for the chapter, is undertaking a survey to line up names of all former volunteer workers for the chapter and soon expects to have a complete list of chairmen and workers for every phase of Red Cross work carried on by the chapter here.

The meeting was the first board session attended by Douglas R. Simms, the new chapter manager.

## Restrictions On Highways

The state highway commission's weekly road summary listed the following restrictions, mostly because of construction:

Santiam highway—27-ton load limit over Deschutes river bridge.

John Day highway—6 miles construction, slight delay, between forest boundary and Unity Junction.

Columbia River highway—Heavy construction on Dodson-Bonneville section Mondays through Fridays. Blasting at 10:45 a.m. Traffic usually gets through every half hour on the half hour beginning at 7:30 a.m., but there are occasional delays of 3 to 6 hours. Road open 2:30 to 6:30 a.m. every day and on Saturdays and Sundays. Very rough and dusty.

Pacific highway—3.6 miles grading and paving between Goshen and Creswell, no delay. .67 mile construction at North Dillard bridge, speed 20 miles an hour. .65 miles of construction 4 miles south of Canyonville to Azalea.

Oregon Coast highway—6 miles now construction south of Tillamook. 1 mile grading and paving at Coos Bay. 2 miles grading and paving on China Camp-Coquille section, detours available. 1 mile grading and piling at Port Orford. 6 miles grading and paving Brookings to state line.

Alsea highway—6 miles grading east of state fish hatchery, rough and dusty. Traffic advised to use U. S. highway 20.

## Roble Talks on Defense Plans

The eventual goal of those agencies engaged in civilian defense is one large fire department for the state that will be in a position to handle any emergency no matter what the cause without undue congestion and without leaving portions without protection.

In this way W. P. Roble, Salem fire chief and fire department coordinator for Marion county, explained the aims of the organization before members of the Salem Kiwanis club during their weekly luncheon Tuesday.

The fire departments of the state have their program well advanced, said Roble. They have a well defined plan worked out, know what equipment is available and where it is located. He described the program as a "move up" scheme, wherein certain fire departments would be called into action to work against a disaster caused by atom bomb, earthquake or a serious conflagration. The districts from which equipment had been called would in turn be protected by adjacent areas.

Roble was appointed coordinator for Marion county in 1948 and since that time has been actively engaged in working out a well planned system for protection.

## Smith Given 7 Years in Prison

Kenneth Orville Smith has been sentenced to seven years in the Oregon state prison for robbing a Salem taxi driver the night of August 5.

The sentence was meted out Tuesday in Marion county circuit court by Judge George R. Duncan.

Smith was also sentenced to a three-year-term for burglary not in a dwelling. He had pleaded guilty to participating in a burglary of Nick's Inn, a Portland road night club, on August 11, the same day that he and two other men escaped from the Marion county jail.

Smith, who was recaptured in Seattle early last week, will serve out his two sentences concurrently.

## Pays to Make Offspring Pay

Portland, Aug. 29 (P)—Oregon haved \$225,304 in a year because a 1949 law makes children financially responsible for their parents, Lea Howard said today.

Miss Howard, administrator for the state public welfare commission, said \$193,247 was collected between July 16, 1949, and July 31 this year. The money came from the children of persons on old age assistance and other welfare rolls.

The rest of the saving, she said, resulted from dropping 431 persons because their children could support them and from denying 248 applications on the same ground.

Some, she said, resisted payment but finally agreed rather than accept publicity of a court action. In no case, she said, did the commission have to go to court.

Miss Howard said today's was the first report on operation of the law and she added the figures indicated the law was a good one.

The commission spent \$18,000 in sending out 110,000 affidavits to relatives of persons on welfare rolls, to obtain information on whether the children were able to contribute to their parents' support.

## House Passes Highway Bill

Washington, Aug. 29 (P)—The house today passed a federal highway aid bill calling for an outlay of \$1,188,000,000 for roads in the two years beginning July 1, 1951.

It accepted a measure worked out by a senate-house conference committee after the two chambers passed varying bills. The senate has not yet acted on the compromise.

The measure does not put up any money but authorizes \$450,000,000 for the primary highway system, \$300,000,000 for the secondary highway system, \$250,000,000 for the urban system and smaller amounts for roads and trails in parks and Indian reservations.

The house originally had passed a bill authorizing \$1,293,000,000. The senate authorized only \$1,138,000,000. The conference committee was appointed to reach a compromise.

The actual money must be voted in a later bill.

## Congress Probes Car Shortage

Oregon's delegation in congress will make a strong presentation at a committee hearing Wednesday for action to relieve the boxcar shortage here, according to word reaching the Capital Journal today from Senator Wayne L. Morse.

"Through the cooperation of a group of us in the senate," wired Senator Morse, "Senator Johnson of Colorado, chairman of the senate committee on interstate and foreign commerce, is holding hearing Wednesday morning on the railroad car shortage problem."

"Some of the western states, including Oregon, are suffering very much from lack of freight cars and the purpose of the hearing is to find out why the Interstate Commerce Commission and various railroads do not make available to western states a large number of the freight cars owned by western railroads, but which are being used at the present time on eastern railroads."

"Some of our western shippers and business interests have represented to my office that the Interstate Commerce Commission could help remedy the car shortage problem in the west if it would require eastern railroads, as it has the power to do, to return to western railroads a larger share of freight cars which seem to have become concentrated in the east."

"I want Oregon shippers to know that the Oregon delegation will make the strongest possible representations at the Wednesday hearing if it is found that the facts support the allegations which Oregon business interests have made to my office about this problem."

Two Killed Near New Era  
New Era, Ore., Aug. 29 (P)—State police said today that Leslie E. Belt, 24, Portland, and Howard E. LaFrambois, 22, a Wisconsin Indian prizefighter, were killed when their automobile crashed head-on into a truck on Highway 99-E.

Officers said the accident occurred at about 1:30 a. m. and the two men were dead on arrival at an Oregon City hospital.

## Supreme Court Rules Hood River Can Tax Rafts

The state supreme court ruled today that Hood River county may levy a \$6,449 tax on some Washington state log rafts which were moored temporarily in the Columbia river in that county.

The logs, 64 rafts of them, were owned by Stebo Incorporated, a company which hauls its logs down the river from Underwood and Lyle, Wash., to its mill five miles west of Vancouver, Wash.

On Jan. 1, 1947, the annual property assessment date, the logs were temporarily in Hood River county, so the county sheriff slapped on the tax.

The company sued the sheriff, claiming that the county had no right to tax property moving in interstate commerce.

Circuit Judge M. W. Wilkinson of Hood River ruled in favor of the company.

But today's decision by Justice George Rossman reversed him, and ordered the tax paid.

In another case, the supreme court ruled that the state gets the \$15,000 estate left by Mr. and Mrs. G. F. Crusan, Sr., who were killed in an automobile accident on the Santiam highway near Cascadia.

Their bodies were found in the river the following day, so it couldn't be determined who died first.

Mr. Crusan had a son and a daughter by a former marriage, but his wife had no children. Circuit Judge Victor Olliver ruled that Mrs. Crusan died first, and that the son and daughter get the estate.

However, the supreme court reversed this ruling, holding that the husband died first, and that the state gets the estate because she had no heirs.

Justice Rossman also wrote this decision.

The court's ruling of last spring, in which it upheld the law banning fixed fishing gear from the Columbia river, still stands, because the court ruled today against giving a rehearing.

The law was passed by the voters.

## Pension Raises Due in October

The president signed the new social security act Monday.

According to R. C. Stillwell, manager of the social security administration office in Salem, increases will be in checks received the first week of October.

The 2,617 people in Marion and Polk counties now receiving \$49,354 each month will receive \$89,976 each month under the old age and survivors features of the social security program.

The increases will not require any action by the beneficiaries.

Mr. Stillwell added, "In addition to these increases, there will be 450 persons past age 65 who will become eligible for monthly old age benefits beginning in September because of liberalization of requirements. Our office is mailing applications to these people."
