Education War Policy Adopted

Portland, Sept. 13 (P)—The same policies maintained during World War II by institutions of the state system of higher education toward war leaves, fee refunding and service to the government were readopted for the Korean crisis by the state board of higher education Tuesday.

This means that staff members called for special service will be granted leaves with the assurance of returning to former positions. Students entering the service can get fee refunds under prescribed conditions and can get course credit when they enter the service near the end of the term. Credit for certain types of work in the service is also provided.

All action recommended Monday by the building and finance committees was confirmed by the board, including selection of a site for a new dental school, and allocation of funds to all

institutions for additional land purchases and plant rehabilitation.

Resignation of Paul C. Packer as third chancellor of the system was formally accepted and a resolution of appreciation for his "four years of effective service" adopted.

The board agreed to assume the cost of educational work in the various institutional dormitories where these have nothing to do with actual living and dining operations. The total for all institutions amounts to just under \$30,000.

School-Move Protest Dispute Lighted by Fiery Cross Burning

Onward, Ind., Sept. 13 (AP)—The burning of a fiery cross in Ku Klux Klan style was injected Tuesday into the dispute over moving high school classes to the rival town of Walton.

Meanwhile, angry parents who have protested the move, resumed their bumper-to-bumper automobile blockade of the Onward consolidated school to prevent high school desks and equipment from being moved out.

98 Pints Blood Given Tuesday

A total of 98 pints of blood was received here when the Portland regional blood center mobile unit came for a four-hour visitation at the First Methodist church.

The amount was not the goal but was a very good showing, states the Red Cross office. Altogether, 118 persons called, but 20 were unable to give blood.

Twenty-five percent of the take was to be shipped overseas to the Korean front as soon as the blood was returned to the Portland center. The center is way behind on its shipments of blood to the armed forces because of the poor showing in all counties participating in the regional center.

Another visit by the mobile unit in Marion county will come the last week of September, the place to be set later. The unit returns to Salem on October 10.

Chin-Up Store Moves To Ferry Street Site

High school students were allowed to pass through the blockade, but once inside the building they had to teach their own classes because Virgil Turner, Tipton township trustee, had ordered the teachers to Walton.

The fiery cross was burned Monday night just north of town. Parents and townspeople who have been picketing the school building for two weeks left their posts to tear it down, and denied they put it there.

Sheriff Claude Berkshire and State Trooper Robert Kelley, called to investigate the blaze, said they believed it was the work of an "outside agitator." They said they didn't think Onward residents were responsible.

Turner's order, issued weeks ago, abolished Onward's prep school and made Walton a joint high school for the two towns. Onward was to serve only as a grade school.

Walton Principal Daily Hunter said the majority of Onward students still defied the consolidation order, with only seven of 75 of the high school students reporting for classes at Walton.

Skippers Think They Netted Red Submarine

Portland, Me., Sept. 13 (AP)—The skippers of two fishing dragners told today how a mysterious underwater object they thought might have been a Russian submarine fouled in their nets and nearly dragged them underwater.

The tale was related by Capt. Arthur W. Jordan of the 110-foot dragger Cherokee and his brother Thomas, skipper of the 86-foot craft Evzone, as they awaited repairs on their cables and nets.

The Cherokee first snagged the mysterious object Wednesday night 180 miles east of Portland. Ten minutes after the nets, made fast with heavy steel cables, were lowered, they pulled taut. The craft, loaded with 75,000 pounds of fish, was dragged stern first for 25 minutes until the cables snapped.

Jordan said he did not believe the object was a whale since cable ends appeared to show evidence of scraping on a metal object. He said it might have been a Russian submarine since the coast guard had told him there were no American subs in the area, and he understood Canada had no submarines.

Shortly thereafter, the Cherokee received a distress call from the Evzone which was dragging less than a mile away. It, too, had become fouled in the underwater object that crewmen

on neither vessel could see.

The Evzone was towed for 90 minutes before her net cables snapped just as her stern was being pulled underwater while the seas poured into her hold.

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Senator Would Get Tough With Russia

Los Angeles, Sept. 13 (AP)—Sen. Olin D. Johnston (D-SC), who says he's tired of "striped pants and cocktail diplomacy," advocates getting tough with Russia, even using the atom bomb.

He told the convention of the National Federation of Federal Employees: "We should serve notice on

Russia without delay that the next act of aggression will mean that the United States will no longer fight in the remote corners of the world but will carry the fight to the very heart of communist aggression, Russia itself.

"Russia has not progressed as far with the atom bomb as has the United States and I for one would not hesitate to use the atom bomb. The time has come to let Russia know that she cannot go on forcing communism on the rest of the world."

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
