

**SIGHTSEEING COMES LATER**

**Newlyweds Spend Two-Day Honeymoon Doing Shopping**

New York, Sept. 21 (AP)—The Statue of Liberty lost out to a furniture show when newlyweds Irvin and Genevieve Gallagher arrived here for a two-day honeymoon.  
"Furniture keeps costing more all the time," said Genevieve. "We decided we'd better make up our minds what we want to buy for our apartment in Cleveland and come back again to sightsee."  
Irvin, 29, went along willingly on a two-hour tour of the National Home Furnishings show. "A couch we picked out back in Cleveland went up \$50 practically while we were looking at it," he said.

A living room rug was at the top of their list. After a short consultation in one corner of the furniture display at Grand Central palace, they agreed to spend \$120, including the rug pad.  
Irvin lingered by a display of wool chenille carpets until his bride tugged his sleeve and whispered "These are too expensive."  
Wool chenille carpeting has advanced almost 15 per cent in price since the start of the Korean war, according to a rug company official.

A display of colorful cotton carpets finally solved the newlyweds' rug problems, though they paused along the way to look at a \$500 scatter rug designed by Henri Matisse.  
"Who wants to walk on something so artistic?" Irvin asked.  
The gray cotton carpet they chose came to \$98.55, without pad.  
"Two months ago it would have cost ten dollars less," the salesman said, then added encouragingly, "but if you'd waited another few months to get

married it would have cost even more. Rugs are due for another price rise."  
By this time, the six months Genevieve and Irvin were engaged began to seem expensive instead of sensible. They inquired timidly about price in the "all-plastic house."  
"It hasn't changed because this stuff is brand new," the exhibitor told them. Everything from built-in bed headboards to coffee tables made of laminated plastic called panelyte were displayed.  
They by-passed the strictly modern plastic for a display of wood furniture.  
"Irv wants to buy good furniture that we'll want to keep," said Genevieve, who plans to continue her nursing at St. Luke's hospital in Cleveland to add to her husband's income as an insurance agent. He spent four years in the army during the last war, but said he thought an eye injury would keep him out again.

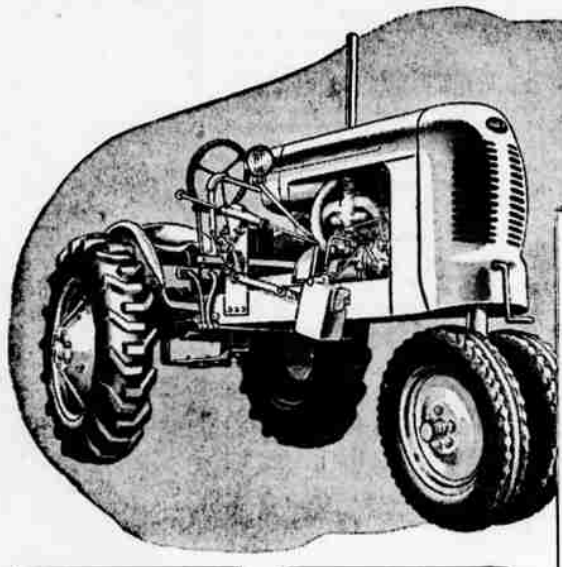

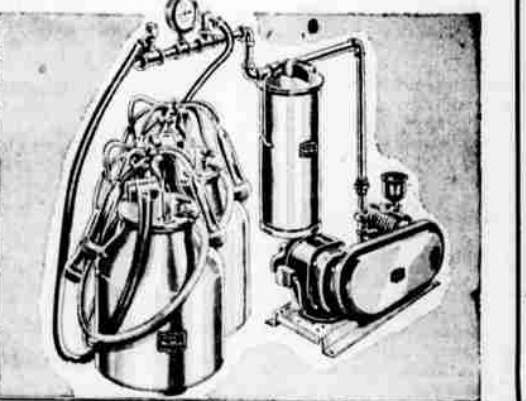

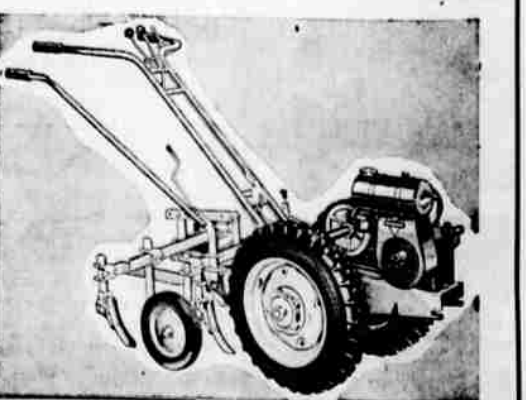
