**Fish a la King**  
Ingredients: 2 tablespoons butter or margarine, 1/2 cup finely diced celery, 1/2 cup finely diced green pepper, 1 tablespoon finely diced pimiento, 2 tablespoons flour, 1/2 teaspoon salt, 1/4 teaspoon pepper, 1 1/4 cups milk, 2 cups flaked cooked fish.

Method: Melt butter or margarine in saucepan over moderately low heat; add celery, green pepper and pimiento and cook for 5 to 10 minutes stirring often. Add flour, salt, and pepper and mix well; remove from heat and add milk gradually stirring as you do and blending in flour and fat lumps. Return to moderately low heat and, stirring constantly, cook until thickened; still stirring allow to bubble for 2 or 3 minutes longer to cook flour thoroughly. Add fish and reheat, stirring carefully so as not to break up fish. Serve over hot biscuits. Makes 6 servings.

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## Filbert Dressing Provides Interest in Holiday Meal

Are you bound by tradition when it comes to preparing Thanksgiving dinner or are you free to establish your own traditions and depart from the old-line dinner menu?

Back in 1821, meal planners probably never heard of filberts and they little would have considered them for stuffing, yet filbert stuffing is full of the nutty goodness that enhances a fowl. It is a modern version of nut stuffing, using the newest of the domestic tree nuts.

The crunchiness of the nuts adds a texture that is pleasing in a bread stuffing. Toast the filberts first to remove a part of the brown skin that covers the nut and to add crispness. To toast, place in a 275 degree oven for 20 minutes. This will loosen the skins of the nuts so they can be removed by rubbing them briskly.

**Easy Filbert Stuffing**  
2 1/2 cups toasted filberts  
2 1/2 cups soft bread cubes  
2 teaspoons salt  
1/4 teaspoon pepper  
1 teaspoon sage  
1 cup chopped celery  
2 tablespoons chopped parsley  
3/4 cup butter or turkey fat  
1/2 cup minced onion  
1/2 cup turkey stock or water  
Saute onion and celery in fat. When translucent, but not browned, add salt, pepper, and sage. Mix thoroughly. Mix chopped filberts and bread cubes. Add onions and seasoning mixture. Mix well. Mix in turkey stock or water. This dressing is enough for a 12-pound turkey, or a proportionately-sized half turkey.
