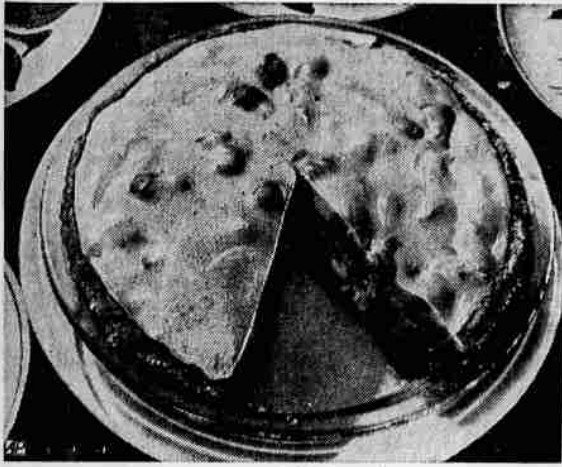


# Washington's Birthday Pie



Cherry Chiffon Pie — Patriotic dessert.

Does your family go for chiffon pies? Then serve them a delicious cherry chiffon on February 22, to celebrate Washington's Birthday. It's made with onomical evaporated milk and tick-as-lightning corn flake mix.

Or take life easier and use a packaged gingerbread mix made in Washington's mother's pride recipe. This mix is economical, too—you can still buy a 14-ounce package fairly reasonably and make about 9 servings from it. To make **Gingerbread** loaves for Washington's Birthday out of the mix, dump into a mixing bowl and blend with 1/4 cup water; roll out the dough to 1/4 to 1/2 inch thickness; cut with a knife into 3-inch angles; bake on a greased king sheet in a moderate (350 degrees F.) oven 10 to 12 minutes. Garnish each tricolor with

a small triangle of hard sauce and a cherry.

**Cherry Chiffon Pie**

**Ingredients:** 4 cups corn flakes, 1/4 cup sugar, 1/2 cup melted butter or margarine, 1 envelope unflavored gelatin, 1/4 cup cold water, 2 1/2 cups canned sour cherries, 1/4 cup sugar, 1 tablespoon lemon juice, 1/4 teaspoon salt, 1/2 cup evaporated milk (thoroughly chilled).

**Method:** Crush corn flakes into fine crumbs. Add 1/4 cup sugar and butter or margarine; mix well. Press evenly and firmly around sides and bottom of 9-inch pie pan. Chill. Soften gelatin in water. Heat cherries with juice and 1/2 cup sugar to boiling point. Remove from heat; stir in softened gelatin, lemon juice and salt; cool. When mixture begins to thicken, fold in whipped evaporated milk. Pour into crum crust; chill until firm.

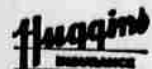
