

Christians to Lay Cornerstone

The laying of the cornerstone will be an event at 3:00 p.m. at the new site of the First Christian church, at Cottage and Marion streets, on Sunday afternoon. The ceremony will mark the near-conclusion of the building project which began two years ago, and which will afford beautiful and spacious quarters for worship and for education for the local congregation. Participating in the event will be Governor Douglas McKay, Mayor Al Loucks, Superintendent Frank B. Bennett, and many local and visiting ministers of various churches. Many memoirs of a historical nature will be deposited in the box by youth of the church. Loud speaking equipment has been provided which will make it possible for all to hear, and the traffic division of the Salem police are blocking traffic at the intersection in order that spectators may stand in the street.

At the morning service of worship, Rev. Dudley Strain announces that special recognition will be given to those who attended or were members of the Little Brick church, the first structure on the present site which was torn down in 1908. Among those attending will be Mrs. W. J. Wellard, whose grandfather, Alex McCarty, was one of the founders of the local church in 1855. Also attending will be Miss Inez Fullerton, whose grandfather donated the land on which the present structure was built in 1907. About 35 other members who attended what was known as the "Little Brick church" have signed their intention to attend, including one family of whom five generations have attended this church. Rev. Strain will preach on the subject "The Chief Cornerstone."

A no-host dinner at noon following the morning service will honor these special guests and provide further opportunity to view some of the pictures and papers and clippings which have been contributed by members and friends for the occasion.
