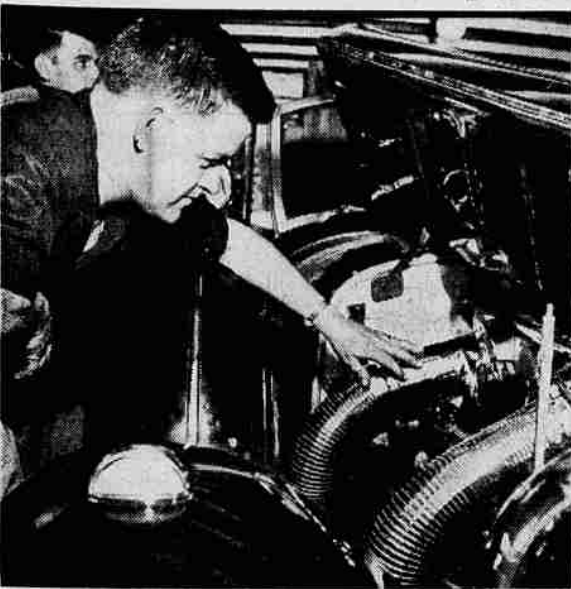

Ach! Dot Der Fuhrer shouldn't hef lived so long! The sign on his once classy Mercedes-Benz, now on display at the Capitol Shopping Center, tells that the original price tag was \$35,000.

The agent in charge of its tour whispered confidentially: "It's for sale."

Gordon P. (Sahara Sam) Keith, used car salesman, cocked an ear and put in a bid: "It's worth \$500 to me. That's top!"

But the agent continued, ignoring Keith, saying the current tag was a mere \$25,000.

Keith's offer was a mere one-seventieth of the original price, but like "Sahara Sam" in L'il Abner he's found foreign models a little hard to peddle.

The Mercedes-Benz, lined with armor and carrying heavy bullet-proof glass, would even be harder than most foreign models to sell. It is burdened with a 230-horsepower engine, supposedly capable of hauling the five-ton vehicle over the autobahn at better than 130 miles an hour.

It gets, so the agent says, three miles to a gallon. It uses hard-to-get 7.50-17 truck tires. That may be why Hitler gave it to Field Marshal Mannerheim in 1942 for a birthday present. He smiled at the Finn when he made the presentation.

## Gas Tax Hike Voted by Group

Washington, June 13 (AP)—The house ways and means committee today voted to boost excise taxes on gasoline, automobiles, and many other items.

Making its final decisions on a bill calling for an overall increase of about \$7,500,000,000 a year in taxes, the committee also decided to broaden the base for the excess profits levy on corporations.

Chairman Doughton (D., N. C.), said the committee expects to take a last minute look at the measure tomorrow and then introduce the bill in the house.

He said he hopes to bring it to a house vote next week.

The bill calls for stiff increases in individual income taxes, corporate levies and excise taxes, and for a new tax on wagering.

The excise increases included: Raising the tax on new automobiles from seven per cent of the manufacturers' price to 10 per cent.

Tax on buses, trucks and automotive parts, from 5 per cent to eight per cent.

Sporting goods tax raised from 10 to 15 per cent, but most equipment used by schools (except baseball goods), and children's toys, exempted.

The tax on gasoline would be raised from 1 1/2 to 2 cents a gallon.

A number of additional electrical, gas and oil driven household appliances, including lawnmowers, floor polishers and hedge clippers, were added to a list now subject to a 10 per cent manufacturers rate.

## Eggs Boosted One Cent Here

Eggs were boosted one cent here all along the line, Wednesday morning, similar advances having been reported on the Portland produce market.

In the new list here buying prices now are: AA, 55 cents; large A, 53-59 cents; medium AA, 43 cents; medium A, 53-55 cents; small, 29-40 cents. Wholesale prices now are quoted generally at 64 cents on A grade and 58 cents on mediums.

All other produce remained unchanged here Wednesday.
