Come Now, George, Tell Us Why You Didn't Marry Young?

Toronto, June 13 (AP)—Physical culturist George Hebbden Corsan—just turned 94—says he is going to throw a birthday party Saturday. Right now he's in the hospital recovering from a broken neck suffered when he fell 20 feet from a tree on May 27.

Corsan—a vegetarian who once labelled medicine "a jumbled heap of ignorance"—didn't want to go to the hospital at all. But doctors thought he'd better, since the fracture was about like that suffered by a man hanged on the gallows. He agreed to go after being assured the visit would only be for X-rays.

Since he's been in the hospital Corsan has fared—over the protest of dietitians—on nothing but orange juice. Yesterday he observed his birthday by eating a banana and a little black bread.

As he munched the banana—one of seven varieties grown on his Miami, Fla., estate—Corsan enthusiastically discussed a new nut he has developed.

"I have developed the finest nut in the world. It is a cross between an Asiatic and Canadian butternut. Come out to my farm Saturday. I am entertaining Toronto vegetarians and you can sample this superior nut."

Doctors said Corsan missed severing his spinal cord by a quarter-inch and had two skull fractures. To almost any other person, they said, the injury would be fatal.

Corsan was married for the third time last January in Florida. He does not drink alcohol, has never smoked and lives on a sugarless diet. He believes in nuts as a basic food and thinks all dairy farms should be turned into fruit farms.

"It would save valuable land," he said. "The farm boys would not smell of manure and could keep their girls."

Hot Dog Price Jump Given Authorization

Washington, June 13 (AP)—The government authorized Tuesday price increases in hot dogs, bologna and other processed meat containing beef.

The order permits these manufacturers to add increases in their costs for beef since January to their current prices. Those prices are now held under the general freeze at the highest levels prevailing between December 19 and January 25.

The order permits the increases to be passed to consumers.

The office of price stabilization (OPS) said that the overall level of new wholesale beef ceilings is about the same as in January. But, it said, some processed meat manufacturers have to pay more for certain types of beef such as boneless beef which is widely used in frankfurters.

The result is that these manufacturers have been "squeezed." The order is temporary and will be replaced by a permanent one, the OPS said.

Paris Turns Back Clock To Grandma's Day for Fete

Paris, June 13 (AP)—The days of Napoleon the third's second empire when Paris swayed to the lilt of Strauss and Offenbach waltzes are being lived again on the famed avenue De Champs Elysees.

For two weeks waiters in most of the sidewalk cafes will be sporting luxuriant side whiskers and mustaches and long white aprons as they serve drinks to tourists on the gas-lit terraces. Every effort is made to make everything look just as it did in Grandma's day.

Turning back the clock on the Champs Elysees is just one of the attractions planned this month to remind Parisians and visitors that the capital of France is celebrating its 2,000th birthday.

A thousand red and blue pennants in second empire style already are fluttering along the avenue. Illuminated arches are being built at every intersection. One hundred of the avenue's 130 shopkeepers are dressing their windows in keeping with the period.

An orchestra wearing period costumes plays in Fouquet's famous restaurant; even the big and brassy Colisee cafe is abandoning neon lighting for the gas-lit globes of a century ago.

Merchants of a type long since vanished from the sidewalks of Paris are out again to revive nostalgic memories.

Every day there is a contest to try and find "Mademoiselle Champs Elysees" walking somewhere in the crowds. The first to spot her each day gets a prize of 20,000 francs (about \$57).

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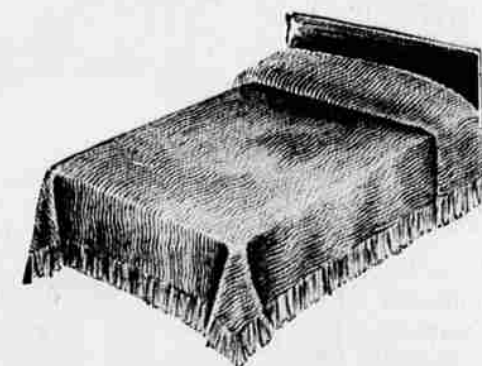
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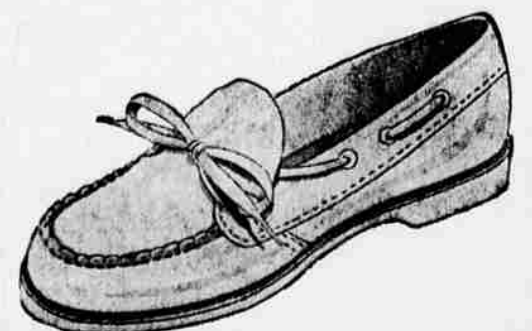
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
