BAKE at 375° F. for 10 to 12 minutes. MAKES about 5 dozen cookies.

Get together 3 1/2 cups sifted Pillsbury's Best Enriched Flour* 1 teaspoon double-acting baking powder 1/4 teaspoon soda 1/4 teaspoon salt
Combine 1/2 cup shortening 1/2 cup sugar; mix well.
Beat in 2 eggs 2 tablespoons milk and 1 teaspoon vanilla.
Beat in 1/2 cup sifted dry ingredients; mix well.
Add 1 cup chopped pecans 1/4 cup chopped maraschino cherries. Mix well.
Shape into balls using 1 level tablespoonful of dough for each cookie.
Brush with 1/4 cup Melling's corn-flakes. Roll each ball of dough in cornflakes.
Place on greased baking sheet. Top each cookie with 1/4 maraschino cherry.
Bake in moderate oven (375° F.) 10 to 12 minutes. Do not stack or store until cold.
*If you use Pillsbury's Best Enriched Self-Rising Flour, omit baking powder and salt; reduce soda to 1/4 teaspoon.
