Somewhere in Korea, Aug. 17 (Delayed by censor) (AP)—United Nations patrols all along the front have been receiving for three days mysterious letters proposing that UN and Chinese Communist front line units arrange an informal armistice themselves while cease-fire talks continue at Kaesong, it was disclosed today.

Russian Historian Attacked by Magazine

Moscow, Aug. 21 (AP)—The magazine Bolshevik has attacked leading Soviet historian Eugene Tarle for allegedly underestimating the genius of Russian Field Marshal Mikhail Kutuzov in defeating Napoleon in 1812. The magazine accused Tarle of relying too much on foreign and bourgeois sources which give much of the credit for Napoleon's retreat to the Russian winter and burning of Moscow. It was discussing his book "Attack of Napoleon on Russia" published in 1943. Tarle wrote a much-discussed article in the English-language magazine "news" last month saying there was no reason for animosity between Russia and the Anglo-Saxon powers.

Miracle Drug Fails To Save Oporto Child

Oporto, Portugal, Aug. 21 (AP)—A "miracle" drug, rushed by air from the United States in response to a radioed plea, failed to save the life of a 9-year-old Oporto victim of spinal meningitis.

Branca Maria Medina Santos died, despite a brief improvement attributed to the drug varibase sent here by the Long Island Press after Branca's father broadcast an urgent appeal for aid.

Santiam Water Declared Safe

Portland, Ore., Aug. 21 (AP)—The state sanitary commission has announced that hundreds of Chinook salmon and other fish killed in the North Santiam river August 11 by the accidental discharge of ammonia at Detroit dam were not contaminating the stream.

The authority made tests of water in the stream at Mill City, 12 miles downstream from the dam. The tests have failed to reveal any contamination. No addition of chlorine has been found necessary since the fish began to die.

The Mountain States Power company, which distributes water at Mill City, said it had received no complaints from water consumers.

However, residents along the river have complained about strong odors caused by decayed fish. Officials estimated 10,000 fish died after the ammonia discharge. Santiago, Chile, is named for Saint James.
