

## 'Fellow Peasants,' Says Dewey To Grants Pass Cavemen

Albany, N. Y., Sept. 21 (AP)—"Fellow peasants," Gov. Thomas E. Dewey said today in a telegram to an Oregon club. "I salute you and congratulate you. The Soviet propaganda machine has admitted you to the exclusive club of the down-trodden masses of America."

## Cavemen to Combat Russ Propaganda

Grants Pass, Sept. 21 (AP)—The Grants Pass Cavemen, whose picture with Gov. Thomas Dewey gave the Russians a good propaganda theme, pledged today to spread the truth about the organization throughout the world.

Joe J. Blunk, chief big horn of the Cavemen, said the group, made up of Grants Pass business and professional men, would work with the Crusade of Freedom to straighten out what "Russian propagandists have distorted into lies."

The photograph showed the New York governor at a Grants Pass festival surrounded by "cavemen" wearing bear skins and waving clubs.

The Russian story accompanying the picture described the Cavemen as "a group of peasants" organized to combat the "wealthy priests and hierarchy" who control America through Wall Street and the church.

Dewey was described as "a known anti-religious leader" who was defeated in his campaign for president by "the Wall Street industrialists."

## Report Barbara Back with Tom

Hollywood, Sept. 21 (AP)—Blonde Barbara Payton's tearful declarations of love for Franchot Tone, who took a beating in a battle for her affections, palled today as rumors spread she was back dating his conqueror, Actor Tom Neal.

An eye-witness said the muscular Neal, who pummeled Tone's features on Miss Payton's front lawn in a pre-dawn brawl last Friday, took the actress out Wednesday night.

Neal called at Miss Payton's home, and they left in an automobile, returning later in the evening, the witness said.

Tone's attorney, Kenneth Chantry, also said the triangle appeared to be doing a flip-flop. "We know Miss Payton and Neal were together last night," he said yesterday.

One-time Child Star Jackie Coogan started the rumors rolling when he reported that Miss Payton and Neal attended a party at his home together while Tone lay injured at California Lutheran hospital with a smashed face and brain concussion.

And Neal's attorney, Milton Golden, said he "wouldn't be surprised" if Neal and Miss Payton were married "after talking with Neal the last few days as I have."

But the voluptuous actress declared angrily that the reports were "ridiculous" and that she would marry Tone "as soon as he gets well."

Neal, she said, "is a beast."

## Petrified Stump Found Near Lebanon

Lebanon — While bulldozing out a log-loading spot on the Russell ranch south of Sweet Home, C. J. Keeney and James Stock unearthed a petrified stump three feet in height and 18 inches in diameter.

It was found four feet under ground and several pieces of petrified tree limbs were found near it. The identity of the species of tree is not known but from the appearance of the grain it is judged to belong to the hardwood family.

Members of the Sweet Home Rock and Mineral society believe it to have been a sycamore tree of which there were many in this area in ages past.

## French Parliament to Aid Catholic Schools

Paris, Sept. 21 (AP)—Parliament today completed action on the first state aid to Catholic schools since France was under German occupation.

By 378 to 236, the national assembly approved a bill for 850,000,000 francs (about \$2,300,000) worth of scholarships, to be awarded students of both public and private schools. To sweeten the bill for anti-clericals, it included 12,000,000,000 francs (about \$34,300,000) for much-needed public school buildings.

## 3 Professors Get Doctorates

Three Willamette university professors were awarded doctorate degrees during the summer—two in education and one in sociology.

Charles H. Derthick, assistant professor of psychology, and Kenneth V. Lottick, assistant professor of social studies, earned their doctorates in education,

and Alfred W. Sheets was awarded a doctorate in sociology from the University of California.

Derthick's degree came as the result of work at Oregon State college while Lottick's advancement was awarded by Harvard university where he held a scholarship.

All three men came to Willamette in 1948. Derthick is a graduate of Mt. Union college, Alliance, Ohio. Lottick holds a master's degree from Columbia university, and Sheets, son of a missionary, and born in India, attended U.S.C. and Chicago

university. Scheduled between his education and teaching were two trips around the world.

## General Motors Boosts Car Prices

Detroit, Sept. 21 (AP)—General Motors boosted the retail prices of its automobiles \$61 to \$209 Wednesday to bring all 12 of the "big three" makes of cars under high-government-approved price tags.

Ford raised prices of its cars \$55 to \$95 last Friday midnight and Chrysler hiked its retail prices from \$90 to \$400 on Monday after both firms received approval from the office of price stabilization in Washington.

The OPS Tuesday night gave GM the go-ahead for higher price tags on Chevrolets, Pontiacs, Oldsmobiles, Buicks and Cadillacs.

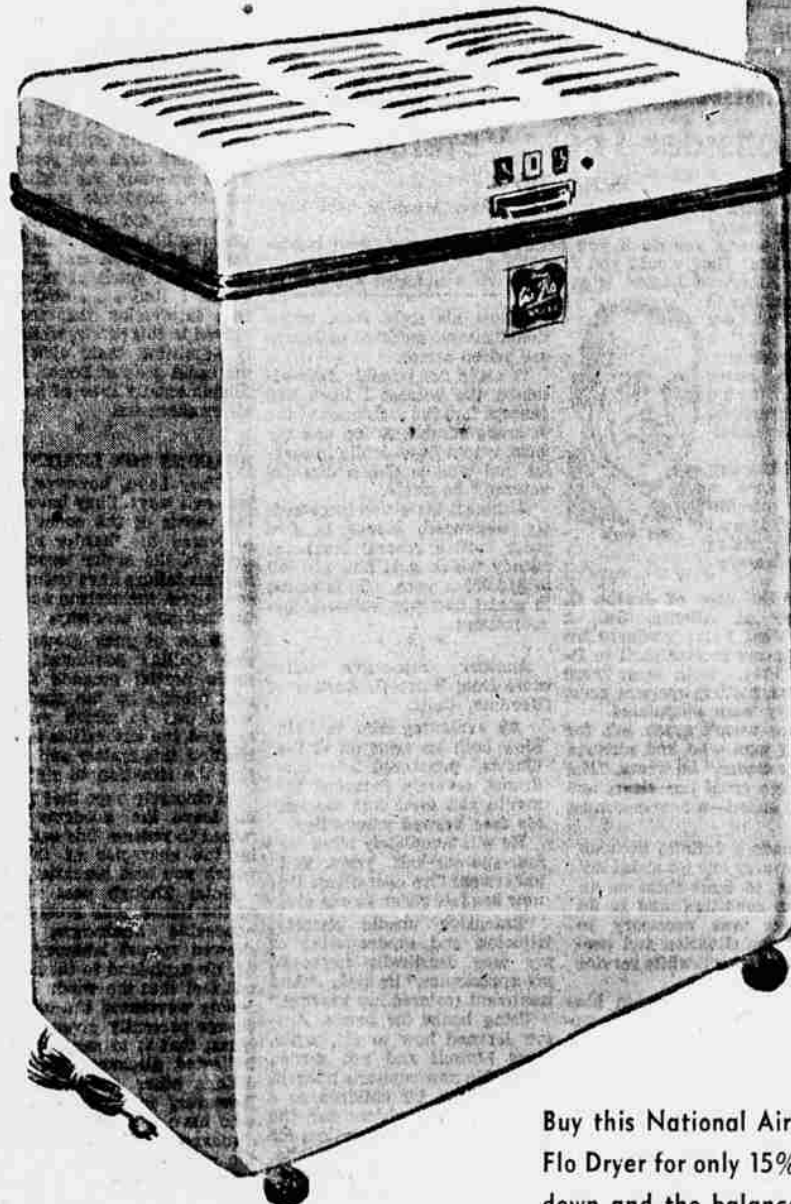
Meanwhile, Studebaker gave its application for price increases to OPS.
