Free Loading for Relief Clothing

Local No. 8 of the CIO longshoremen's union in Portland notified Governor Douglas McKay Friday its membership had voted to load, free of charge, all clothing assembled in Portland for the needy of Korea.

Local Secretary D. T. Siddall advised the governor that the union voted unanimously to endorse the Clothes for Korea drive, as well as to load the garments without charge. He said the action is in line "with our established policy of supporting humanitarian projects."

Local No. 8 commended Governor McKay "for the leadership you have displayed in this worthy project" and expressed hope that the drive would be a success. The governor was responsible for merging some 25 state-wide organizations into a voluntary food-and-clothing collection group known as Oregon Relief for Korea and India.

The Oregon chief executive, in thanking the union for its "most generous offer," estimated that between 80 and 100 tons of clothing have been gathered in Oregon during the special campaign.

Col. Walseth Due Here Coming Week

Coming to Salem next week is Col. H. S. Walseth, director of reserves for the 13th Marine Corps Reserve district, Seattle.

The colonel, who only recently returned from Korea, where he served as personnel officer for the First Marine division, is slated to arrive here Monday morning aboard the plane of Rear Adm. Allan E. Smith, commandant of the 13th Naval district. The admiral is to address the Chamber of Commerce luncheon that day.

During his stay here Col. Walseth will visit the office of the inspector-instructor for the Marine Corps Reserve and the Naval and Marine Corps Reserve training center.

Weary G. I. Mumbles 'It's a Heartbreak'; Names Peak

U.S. Eighth Army Headquarters, Korea, Oct. 13. (AP)—At first they called it just "a fog shrouded ridge north of Yanggu."

Then an American soldier came stumbling down the slopes, almost in tears. He was shaking his head and mumbling, as soldiers will when they have looked too long into the face of death.

"It's a heartbreak," he kept saying, "it's a heartbreak."

AP Correspondent Stan Carter heard him.

"There couldn't be any other name for Heartbreak Ridge after that," Carter said today after the last Red-held peak fell to American and French infantrymen.

Carter used the descriptive phrase in his front-line story that day, Sept. 17. The fierce fight for the key peak in the bloody battle of the hills was a week old.

Other news agencies picked it up. Stars and Stripes and the armed forces radio sent it back to Korea.

Soon it returned to the 23rd regiment on the craggy heights of heartbreak. It swept through the ranks like wildfire.

Last week the Eighth army made it official. The term Heartbreak Ridge appeared for the first time in the official communiqué.

'Rhythm Method' Slot Machine Boys Plan to Remain in Idaho

Lewiston, Idaho, Oct. 13.—Three slot machine players who developed a "rhythm method" for cleaning up on the one-armed bandits said today they plan to spend "years" in Idaho at their chosen work.

"Anyone can watch us for 20 years and they'll never figure out our method," gloated Danny Foster, one of the three.

Foster and his companions, Johnny Pugh and Robert E. Black, said they will pay no attention to "warnings from several local operators" to "lay off Lewiston slots."

They previously had been asked to leave Reno, Nev., where they were doing something, but as far as we could see it was above board.

Meanwhile, other Reno gamblers suggested the three are using a "touch and pace" system, in which the player feeds coins into a machine at a methodical pace, exerting just enough pressure on the machine's main spring to keep the pay reels repeating.

Brodsky estimated each one of the three was hitting a jackpot once in every 15 plays.

Foster said the "time between pulls is the governing factor."

WCTU President Shows Improvement

Gadsden, Ala., Oct. 13. (AP)—Mrs. D. Leigh Colvin of Evansville, Ill., national president of the Women's Christian Temperance Union, was reported in an improved condition after injuring herself in a fall.

Mrs. Colvin, here to attend an Alabama WCTU convention, fractured her right arm Thursday when she slipped on a rug, hospital attendants said.

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Morse Confident Ike Can Win Nomination Then Beat Harry

Washington, Oct. 13. (AP)—Two republican senators say they are confident Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower will be a candidate for president on the GOP ticket next year. And Thursday night Senator Duff (R-Pa.) said in a radio interview he expects to get a "definite and decisive" statement from Eisenhower at a meeting about Jan. 1.

Senator Ives of New York and Morse of Oregon, said in separate interviews with newsmen they are confident the general will win the republican nomination and then go on to defeat President Truman or any other democrat.

Duff has been a leader, with Gov. Thomas E. Dewey of New York, in booking the World War Two hero for the GOP nomination.

Ives, longtime political ally of Dewey said the very fact Eisenhower has thus far kept silent supports his views. He said:

"If General Eisenhower were going to refuse to be a candidate, he would have said so long ago. Therefore he would seem to be definitely available."

Duff spoke on MBS's "Reporters Roundup." He said he felt sure Eisenhower will accept a GOP nomination next year. Duff called the general "the only figure around whom the American people can be united."

He plans to meet with Eisenhower about the first of the year—he did not say where—and get from him a statement of intentions.

Ives and other Eisenhower supporters said they are not surprised by a copyrighted story of the Milwaukee Journal saying that Gen. Douglas MacArthur had informed Wisconsin republican leaders he favors Senator Taft (R., Ohio).

Aides of MacArthur in New York City said he had met with a Wisconsin republican leader but they would not confirm or deny the story he supports Taft.

Ives said the Milwaukee story and a report to Taft by political advisers that he could win the nomination "simply serve as a warning to Eisenhower supporters that they must redouble their efforts in his behalf."

Taft has not yet formally announced his candidacy.

Morse, in a senate speech, came out strongly for Eisenhower after Senator Brewster (R-Me.), an ardent Taft backer, said the general was indispensable on his present assignment as commander of North Atlantic defense forces in western Europe.

Brewster said he could "not picture General Eisenhower turning tail" and leaving Europe next spring when, he declared, there would be critical danger of a Russian invasion.

Morse replied Eisenhower was "not indispensable in his position in Europe or in any other position." He said that was "where political opponents want to keep him," but "history has destined him to serve the American people."

Morse, who often differs with republican leaders, said he "could think of nothing that would cause greater disunity in our country and cause more uncertainty and disturbance than to have nominated at the republican convention next summer a reactionary republican."

King Farouk to Get Palace Alexandria, Egypt, Oct. 13. (AP)—Egypt will build a state palace for King Farouk in Khartoum, the government announced today. Khartoum is the capital of the Anglo-Egyptian Sudan which Egypt has demanded Britain evacuate leaving her in sole control.

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Attempt to Kill Junta Foiled

Caracas, Venezuela, Oct. 13. (AP)—The government announced today that "terrorist elements" of the outlawed Accion Democratica attempted to assassinate the ruling military junta last night. It said the attempt failed.

A communique said an unreported number of terrorists hurled a bomb at the country's rulers as they were leaving official ceremonies at the Plaza de Colon (Columbus Plaza). It said the military police foiled the attempt.

The communique said other terrorists seized government buildings in the towns of Rio Caribe, Tunapucito and Caucedo but soon lost control of them. It said two persons were killed and one wounded.

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
