Cheese and Rice Dish
Ingredients: 6 hard-cooked eggs, 2 cups hot medium white sauce, 2 cups cooked rice, 3/4 cup chopped American cheddar cheese, 3/4 cup chopped ripe olives, salt and pepper.

Method: Cut eggs into lengthwise halves. Mix white sauce, rice, 1/4 cup of the cheese, and olives. Pour half of mixture into buttered baking dish, cover with eggs and sprinkle with salt and pepper; add remaining rice mixture and sprinkle with remaining cheese. Bake in moderate (350 F.) oven about 30 minutes or until cheese is melted. Makes 6 servings.
