Prison Terms Given to Four

Albany—Four persons, including a man and wife, were sentenced to serve terms in the state penitentiary and one to a Linn county jail term by Judge Victor Oliver in circuit court Monday.

Sentenced to serve three years each were Harry and Dorothy Erickson, who pleaded guilty to charges of obtaining money under false pretenses.

Arraigned on larceny charges were Dewaine Denzil Curtis and Harold M. Drum, who also pleaded guilty and were sentenced to two years each. Both were accused of theft from a Linn county sawmill.

Russell Estlick, admitting a non-support charges, was sentenced to six months in the county jail.

Judge Oliver paroled Curtis, Drum and Estlick, the last named on condition he resume contributions to the support of his 2-year-old child.

Mr. and Mrs. Erickson were taken to the state prison by Linn officials Monday. Drum, Curtis and Estlick are being taken before the state parole board.

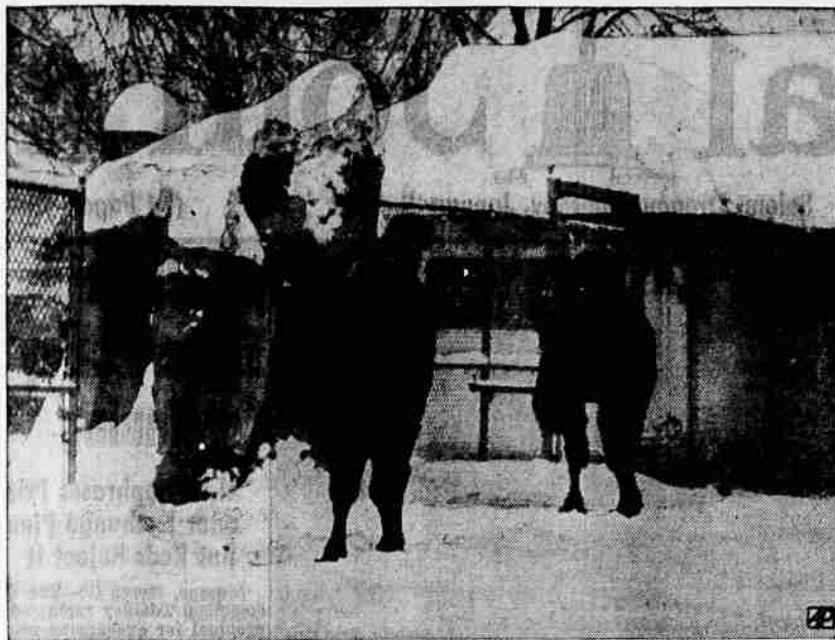
