

Coaches Stick to Illini; Writers Favor Kansas

New York (AP) — The University of Kansas Jayhawks remained the No. 1 college basketball team for the second straight week Tuesday in the nation-wide Associated Press poll—but Illinois is hanging on closely in second place.

The nation's sportswriters and sportscasters sent in 102 ballots, and Kansas got 38 firsts for a total of 812 points. A week ago, only 12 points separated Kansas and the No. 2 team, Illinois. This week, Illinois received 21 first place votes, and had 774 points, or 38 points behind Kansas.

Washington split a pair with Idaho last week and dropped from No. 3 to No. 6. The Huskies received one first place vote and had 293 points.

There were two newcomers to the top 10, Seton Hall moving into the No. 9 spot from No. 11, and Iowa taking over No. 10, after being No. 12. St. John's of Brooklyn, beaten only by Kentucky, skidded from No. 8 to No. 12. New York University dropped from No. 6 to 13.

St. Louis jumped from seventh to the No. 5 spot. Kansas State defeated Arizona and advanced from No. 9 to No. 7, while St. Bonaventure moved from No. 10 to No. 8 after beating Westminster, Pa.

The top 20 in order were: Kansas, Illinois, Kentucky, Indiana, St. Louis, Washington, Kansas State, St. Bonaventure, Seton Hall, Iowa, West Virginia, St. John's, New York U., Syracuse, Louisville, Duquesne, Siena, Oklahoma City, Michigan State and Dayton.

Others receiving votes included Utah, Idaho, Seattle University, Minnesota, Stanford, UCLA and Montana.

Portland Man Holds Tie for Billiard Lead

San Francisco (AP) — Jimmy Mills of San Jose and Howard Lindley of Portland, Ore., both won Monday night to maintain a three-way undefeated tie for the lead in the S.F. open pocket billiards tournament.

Mills, with a high run of 45, required only six innings to defeat Bob Archer, Portland, 125-52.

Lindley defeated Maurice (Tugboat) Whalen of San Francisco, 125-80, featuring a high run of 55 in his 14 innings.

New York (AP) — Lou Limmer, who had the unenviable job of playing understudy to Ferris Fain last season, and Cy Block, who managed a team Lou played in in Puerto Rico, were exchanging reminiscences the other day. That is, Cy was doing most of the talking and Lou would get in an occasional word or just nod his head in agreement.

"The club had 11 directors," said Cy, "and before the game I'd get 11 different lineups from them. They all wanted to tell me how to manage the club. We had a pretty good shortstop from the United States but he just couldn't get started down there. Went the first 37 times without a hit and they wanted me to fire him. . . . One night, late, I saw all 11 directors in the little square in the middle of town falling over themselves, each one trying to show how he played short. . . . The next day the boy made a couple of sensational plays and then drove in a run that won the game. . . . I looked over at the box of the directors and there were all 11 of them on their feet screaming 'Rizzuto!'"

Somebody asked Limmer if the players all were "Yanquis" and he managed to reply "only five on each club" before Block took over. . . . "Some of those Puerto Rican kids will be good players, but we got them when they were kids about 16. And gosh, were they green. . . . And then he missed two more just to prove to everybody that the sun really was in his eyes."
