Put remaining tomato juice in a saucepan and heat until almost boiling; add softened gelatin, lemon juice, and Worcestershire sauce; stir until gelatin is dissolved. Pour into 4 or 5 small containers and chill until firm. Unmold and garnish with salad greens; serve with salad dressing. Makes 4 or 5 servings.
