Woodburn Plans Parking Restrictions for Safety

Woodburn — Two ordinances were drafted by the Woodburn city council at the regular meeting providing for one side parking on East Lincoln and Harrison street, and prohibiting parking of vehicles on the south side of the entire length of Harrison street and East Lincoln.

This action is sought to eliminate the traffic hazard caused by parking congestion of the heavily traveled streets. The ordinances will be submitted at the Feb. 19 council meeting.

A resolution to rescind the statement of policy against water connections outside the city limits until the water supply became adequate was brought up on request of Terminal Ice and Cold Storage Co., for a connection to provide fire protection and emergency facilities for the plant now being constructed.

The company will have its own well to provide for regular use and desires the connection only for emergency. The rescinding of the policy was approved.

Improvement of Bryan street from Young street north to the edge of the new subdivision with gravel and drainage was authorized in a resolution adopted. The recreation and park board recommendation against selling trees in Legion park was accepted and a contract is to be made with the state forestry department relative to thinning the grove.

Authorization was also given for spraying in the city this spring to control mosquitoes. City Engineer Bell reported he had started proceedings to obtain government priorities for steel and machinery for the proposed city sewage disposal plant. A call for bids was issued for gasoline for municipal use and two new lights were authorized on Tomlin avenue.

John Schmid, who operates the garbage disposal business here under a city license, requested that the business be placed on a franchise basis. This would result in his filing rates with the council, any changes to be approved by that body.

Woodburn Gets Storage Plant

Woodburn — Contracts have been let for the construction of a 610,000 cubic foot capacity processing and cold storage plant in Woodburn by the Terminal Ice & Cold Storage company and work on the project has been started, according to announcement by Lowell E. Kern of Portland, executive vice president and general manager of the concern.

The structure probably the first of several units to be built here by the company, is expected to be completed about June 1 of this year.

The main building will be 138 by 286 feet and will be 31 feet high. The walls will be of eight-inch reinforced concrete and have another eight inches of fiber glass insulation.

The entire area to be covered by the building will be excavated and filled with 18 inches of rock. Under this and 50 inches below the main floor will be 7,500 feet of wrought iron pipe through which warm oil will be pumped to keep the ground from freezing and heaving the building. On the rock will be a six-inch reinforced concrete sub floor, then eight inches of fiber glass insulation and finally a five-inch reinforced concrete wearing floor.

The interior will be divided into four large storage rooms separated by a 20-foot by 133-foot hallway. There will be no posts in the storage rooms, the roof being supported by 14 Warren-type trusses extending across the width of the building and resting at the center on the room partitions.

Adjoining the main building will be a 72-foot by 35-foot engine room, 14 feet high. In front of the engine room will be the offices.

The plant is to be located on a nine-acre tract east of Woodburn between the Mt. Angel highway and the Southern Pacific tracks just north of the Birds Eye cannery. A spur track from the S.P. railroad will be constructed and it is understood that the Birds Eye plant will probably put in an overhead conveyor between the two plants. Maximum payroll will be approximately 25 persons, according to Kern.

The construction contract was awarded to Ross B. Hammond company of Portland, the insulation contract to Fiberglass Engineering & Supply Co. of Portland and equipment will be provided and installed by the Lewis Refrigeration & Supply Co., also of Portland; engineering by James & Honey.
