Green Lima Bean Salad
Ingredients: 1 package frozen green lima beans, 1/2 cup finely diced celery, well-seasoned mayonnaise, romaine or lettuce leaves, 2 hard-cooked eggs, 1 canned drained pimiento.
Method: Cook lima beans according to directions on package; drain well. Mix with celery and enough mayonnaise to moisten well. Put romaine or lettuce on 4 salad plates, pile lima bean mixture over greens. Slice hard-cooked eggs and cut pimiento in strips and use for garnishing salads.
