CHERRY FILLING: Drain 1 (No. 3) can red sour cherries; save juice. Combine 2 tbsp. cornstarch, 1/4 to 1/2 cup sugar and dash salt. Stir in 1/2 cup canned cherry juice. Cook until thick and clear. Add 1 tsp. almond extract. Turn drained cherries into pie shell; add thickened juice and dot with 2 tbsp. butter. Cover with lattice pastry. TO MAKE LATTICE TOP: Roll remaining dough as above. Peel off top paper. Cut into 1/2-inch strips. Weave strips crisscross on waxed paper. Flip quickly over filling. Seal ends without moistening and flute edge. Bake in hot oven, 425° F., about 40 minutes.
