Freddie Wing, 'American as a Hot Dog,' Has House-Warming

Sonoma, Calif. (AP)—Freddie Wing, "as American as a hot dog" despite his Chinese ancestry, invited 200 friends to a house-warming in his new \$12,000 home in an otherwise all-white neighborhood. All 200—white and Chinese—showed up. They feasted on barbecued pig and roast chicken with almonds. They got cocktails from a bar set up in the garage. They brought gifts for the home. To Robert M. Lynch, editor of the weekly Sonoma Index-Tribune, there was nothing unusual in the party. He explained: "Freddie's lived here 15 years. He's highly respected. . . . Is chef and part owner of the Swiss Hotel. . . . A World War II veteran whose commanding officer, Col. John Cotton, said Freddie served the best officers' mess in Europe."

Guests included Mrs. H. H. Hap Arnold, widow of the wartime Air Force chief; Colonel Cotton, Mayor Monroe, Lynch, businessmen and other friends of Caucasian and Chinese blood. . . . They came from this community of 2,000—where California's Bear flag first was raised—and points as far as San Francisco and Fresno. Editor Lynch said he saw no unusual news value in Wing's party, so routinely printed it on the society page. "Freddie's just another good guy in the community," Lynch said, "and his party was just another housewarming of a fellow citizen. His specialty may be chow mein but to us he's as American as the hot dog."

R.R. Station Blast Kills Five

Tunis, Tunisia (AP)—A bomb blew up in Gabes Railroad Station Wednesday night as a train drew in killing five persons and injuring 17 others. Police and government sources hinted Communists have taken a hand in Tunisian violence and were inclined not to blame Nationalists, who have carried out previous raids to enforce their demands for more independence from French rule. The Nationalists said they had nothing to do with the station explosion. Sources close to French Resident General Jean de Hautecloque took a similar view.

Marines to Draft No Men After June 30

Washington (AP)—The Marine Corps says it plans to draft no more men after June 30 because volunteer enlistments are increasing and the Corps is nearing its authorized strength of 235,320. The Marine Corps has drafted 73,430 men since last August when it turned to Selective Service for the first time after volunteers failed to meet replacement needs. The April quota is 4,000.
