Rice and Eggplant Dish
Lettuce and Cucumber Salad
Bread and Butter
Fruit Beverage

Rice and Eggplant Dish
Ingredients: 1 small (1 1/4 pounds) eggplant, 6 strips bacon, 1 clove garlic (peeled and minced), 1 cup finely diced onion, one 8-ounce can (1 cup) tomato sauce, 3/4 cup hot water, 1 1/2 teaspoons salt, 1/4 teaspoon pepper, 1/4 teaspoon cinnamon, 1/2 cup granulated rice cereal.

Method: Peel and cut eggplant into 1/2-inch cubes; there should be about 6 cups. Cook bacon until crisp; drain well and reserve. Add garlic and onion to bacon fat and cook 5 minutes, stirring often. Add tomato sauce and 1/2 cup of the water. Sprinkle in salt, pepper, and cinnamon. Bring to boil. Sprinkle in rice cereal. Cook and stir constantly until cereal thickens slightly. Add eggplant. Mix well with rice. Mix remaining 1/4 cup water in lightly.

Cover tightly and cook over low heat until eggplant is tender, about 25 minutes. Crumble bacon and sprinkle over top. Makes 4 generous servings.
