Knight Memorial To Hear Brown

Recently returned from service in the Philippines as a Congregational missionary under the American Board of Foreign Missions, the Rev. Elton W. Brown will be guest preacher Sunday morning at the Knight Memorial Congregational church, and will speak at an evening meeting at 7:30 and show slides of his work in the Philippines and exhibits of native craft work.

Mr. Brown's duties in the Philippines included traveling thousands of miles by truck over almost impassable roads, overseeing the building of little churches, distributing relief funds, Bibles, hymnals and other books, and administering \$42,000 for the reconstruction of churches damaged by the war. He traveled over 25,000 miles supervising the building of these churches.

Born in Massachusetts, Mr. Brown received his education at Gordon college and Harvard Divinity school, and held pastorates in Massachusetts before going to the Philippines.

Building Church At Silverton

Silverton—One of the outstanding church building projects in Silverton in the past few years is under way, in the Methodist program.

The ground breaking ceremony was featured two weeks ago in a Sunday afternoon program. Since then eight large shade trees have been removed from the curbing and grounds to make ready for the construction of the new edifice which is to be built in the rear of the present church building that is close to the side walks on West Main and Fiske St.

Rev. Douglas Harrell, resident pastor, states that Fred Blumenkamp, supervisor of construction, plans to finish excavation and foundation plans during this week.

Two phases of the building are to be placed by mid-autumn months, the cornerstone of the structure, and the large arches. The next meeting of the building committee is being called by Rev. Harrell shortly after 12 noon, Sunday, June 15.

Following the 9:45 a.m. church school Sunday, ceremonial of baptism for infants and reception of new members will precede the sermon by the pastor at the 11 o'clock worship hour.
