Stage Urged at N. Marion High

Hubbard — Plans for completing the gymnasium and auditorium at North Marion union high school with a stage and band room have been studied and outlined by the budget committee and the board of education.

An analysis of the proposed completion of the budget committee recommends is: That a stage and band room be built onto the present west end of the gymnasium and cell the auditorium.

That it may be completed as soon as the money can be raised by a special tax levy which is to be spread over a two-year period starting with the 1952-53 school year.

That the addition of a stage with a band room underneath will help to relieve a crowded and conflicting situation that now exists in the basement beneath the gym, namely:

1—The present cafeteria is too small.

2—The present agriculture shop is too small.

3—There is a four-way conflict between the ag shop, band room and cafeteria all in the basement with the gym directly above all three.

4—Scheduling of classes is difficult due to the above-mentioned conflict.

5—As the school grows, more room will be needed for cafeteria use.

That the addition of a stage will enable the school and organizations of the community to sponsor and put on activities in the present auditorium with greater ease and help greatly in such events as graduation, May Day, Christmas programs, band concerts, etc. The addition of a band room will provide more space for the ag shop and cafeteria, and ceiling of the auditorium will relieve the bad acoustical situation now existing and provide a better auditorium for people of the district to enjoy the many activities sponsored throughout the year.

A proposed special tax levy election is to be held June 30, 1952, from 2 to 8 p.m. at the school. Levy to be in the amount of \$90,000 to be spread equally over a period of two years beginning with the school year 1952-53.

All residents, registered voters, who have resided in school district No. 6 for six months or more may vote on the proposal.

On the budget committee are Norman Yergen, Ivan DeArmond, William Gooding, Cecil Lenhardt and Martin Albers. On the board of education are John McCrone, Clifford Blake, Isaac Williamson, Glen L. Yergen and William Fobert.
