Woodburn Sets Swim Schedule

Woodburn — Free swimming instruction at the Woodburn war memorial swimming pool at Settlemier park will begin Tuesday, July 8, with five classes planned for the first period by Miss Norene Wells, life guard and instructor.

A summer recreation program at the pool is also planned including adult swims, family night swims, water polo, water baseball, swim to music and a water show.

The schedule for the first group of free swimming classes is as follows: 10:30 a.m. to 11:15 a.m., beginners 10 years of age and over; 11:15 a.m. until noon, beginners 10 years of age and under; 12:30 p.m. to 1:15 p.m., intermediates; 1:15 p.m. to 2 p.m., intermediate or advanced; 6 p.m. to 7 p.m., adult beginners.

Recreation swimming is scheduled Tuesdays through Saturdays from 2 to 5:45 p.m. and 7 to 9:45 p.m. The Sunday schedule of recreation swimming will be from 1 to 3:30 p.m.

The first series of classes open Tuesday and continue daily through July 12, resume July 15 and close July 18. Registrations may be made with the matron, Mrs. Etta Arvin, at the pool office during hours the pool is open.

Beginners must be 7 years of age or over and at least 48 inches tall. The free instructions are conducted as a part of the city recreation and park program.

The first family night swim is scheduled for Friday, July 11, and children must be accompanied by one or both parents. The next Friday evening will be reserved for adult swimmers and the two programs will alternate on successive Friday evenings for the balance of the season. Swimming to music is planned for Saturday nights, with water polo and water baseball slated for Sunday or Thursday evenings or both. The water show, races and demonstrations are planned for Aug. 31 and Sept. 1.
