'Fly-in' at Lebanon Draws 132 Visiting Oregon Planes

Lebanon — On Sunday, 132 ships landed on the Lebanon air-ports and for the fourth consecutive year the fly-in took honors for the greatest number of planes at the state's series of civilian aviation events.

Planes began arriving shortly before 9 a.m., with the greatest influx of sky travelers winging in just before the noon hours. Main air events were two 15-mile races in which Dr. M. O. Perkins of Lebanon in his Stinson, placed first in the 165 h.p. craft. Don Neal of Sweet Home, made the fastest time in the 65 h.p. class.

Other competitions at the field included a log chopping contest.

Dallas

Dallas — The Dallas City fire department has been kept busy over the week-end extinguishing small fires that have been cropping up due to the sweltering heat and lowering humidities.

Saturday, July 26 a blaze erupted in the grain field of Lenord Berg on the Orchard Knob road, burning about 1/2 of an acre before it was halted. Mr. Berg suffered second degree burns in fighting the fire.

Sunday, July 27, a fire burned the ramp of the Dallas Lock-Ree slaughter house but the blaze did not damage the main building. A fire also started Sunday out near Salt Creek when a field belonging to the Rhode Brothers burned. An acre was burned but the grain had already been combined and stacked away from the blaze.
