NO BOREDOM IN PROSPECT

Many Chances for Surprises In the Presidential Election

Washington, (AP)—This year the voters can be grateful to the two presidential candidates for saving them from the boredom of previous elections.

Everyone is looking forward to hearing Gen. Eisenhower and Gov. Stevenson when the campaign starts since practically nobody knows much about the views of either of them.

This reverses the usual condition of voters who in past years not only knew the views of the candidates but had heard them so often anything they said during the campaign was repetition.

And this year there's a chance for surprise.

At the time of the conventions Eisenhower was supposed to be to the right of Stevenson who was supposed to be to the right of President Truman.

But the practical necessity of trying to win votes may push both men into some shifts in their position.

Both men and their advisers know that in a close election the votes of southern whites and northern Negroes may tip the scales.

After the nomination of Eisenhower, who is going to campaign in the south, it was thought he might be able to win some of that usually democratic area away from the democrats.

Banks Buy Bonds for Schools at Lebanon

Lebanon—The First National bank of Lebanon and the First National of Portland were successful bidders for two issues of Linn county school district bonds, announced J. H. Irvine, president of the First National of Lebanon.

Funds raised for school district 73 amounted to \$55,000. This issue will be used for the construction of a two-room grade school at Lacombe, Maturing serially from 1953 through 1966 the net cost to the district on the bid is 2.713%.

Proceeds raised for school district 78 total \$14,500 and will be used for improvements at Denny school. Maturing serially from 1953 through 1966, the bonds were purchased at an interest cost of 2.95%.

Parcel Post Father, David J. Lewis, Dies

Cumberland, Md. (AP)—Former Rep. David J. Lewis, father of the nation's parcel post system, died at Memorial Hospital here Tuesday.

The 83-year-old attorney had been seriously ill three or four months.

He served six terms in the House of Representatives, from 1911 through 1916 and 1931 through 1936.

During his early terms in Congress, Lewis sponsored the establishment of the parcel post.

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Lodolce Faces Trial in Absentia

Rome (AP)—Two Americans accused of the 1944 slaying of their commanding officer in the Alps will be tried in absentia shortly, an Italian government spokesman said Tuesday.

The spokesman disclosed this after a federal court judge in Buffalo, N.Y., turned down Italy's plea to extradite Carl G. Lodolce, former sergeant in the Office of Strategic Services, now living in Rochester, N.Y.

Lodolce, a tool engineer, and former Lt. Aldo Icardi, Pittsburgh, have been charged with the killing of Maj. William V. Holohan behind German lines Dec. 6, 1944. He was poisoned and shot and his body was thrown into a lake, according to a confession by two Italian partisans charged with complicity in the case.

The government spokesman said the two partisans would go on trial shortly and that Lodolce and Icardi probably would be tried in absentia at the same time. Extradition proceedings against Icardi have not been instituted.

Nation Needs Doctors, Dentists

Washington (AP)—The president's commission on health needs of the nation was told Tuesday that thousands more dentists, nurses and medical assistants are needed to care for the American people.

Summaries of panel discussions held during the last two months by 21 medical, military and lay experts were presented at the opening of a two-day session by the commission.

The panel summaries indicated the exact shortage of trained people, including physicians and surgeons, depends upon how U.S. medical care is "organized."

Proposing a plan for doing this is one purpose of the commission. President Truman appointed its members last December. He has been plugging for a national compulsory health insurance plan. The commission was told to study the facts and present a program for "safeguarding and improving the health of the nation."

Space Ship to Cost Half-Billion

ASHLAND (AP)—An aeronautics education official says a space ship could be built now for a cool half-billion dollars.

Roscoe Bancroft, director of civil aeronautics education in Oregon, Washington, Idaho, Wyoming and Alaska, said he fully expects his nine-year-old son to have a chance to make a trip to the moon some day.

Bancroft made his remarks to a group of educators at Southern Oregon College of Education here.

He urged teachers to teach in the light of the world in which children will be living 20 to 30 years from now.

Such questions as "freedom of the air" and ownership of the strategic north pole are going to be vital ones in the future, he said.

Farm Expenses Up; Net Income Down

Incomes of farm and city people is often compared with little attention to the complex business of modern agriculture statistics that say non-farm income has jumped 39 per cent since 1947 while gross farm incomes are up only 9 percent.

Farm production expenses are up 30 per cent over 1947 and net farm income is down 12 per cent. Net farm income five years ago to farmers was 17 billion dollars, today that's down to 15 billion.

Canada's Exports Climb to 2.1 Billion

Ottawa (AP)—Canada's exports climbed to a peak \$2,100,000,000 during the first six months of 1952.

They were pushed ahead, the bureau of statistics reported Tuesday, by a marked expansion in shipments to the United Kingdom, Latin America and most European markets.

While these markets provided the main impetus for a big, 20 per cent jump over last year's comparative six months total of \$1,760,000,000, shipments to the United States also were slightly higher, passing the billion-dollar mark for the second successive year, the bureau said.

The installation covers 35 acres. It is expected to be in operation by September of next year.

Douai, France, (AP)—Three miners were killed and 17 others injured in a coal mine explosion here in northern France Tuesday.



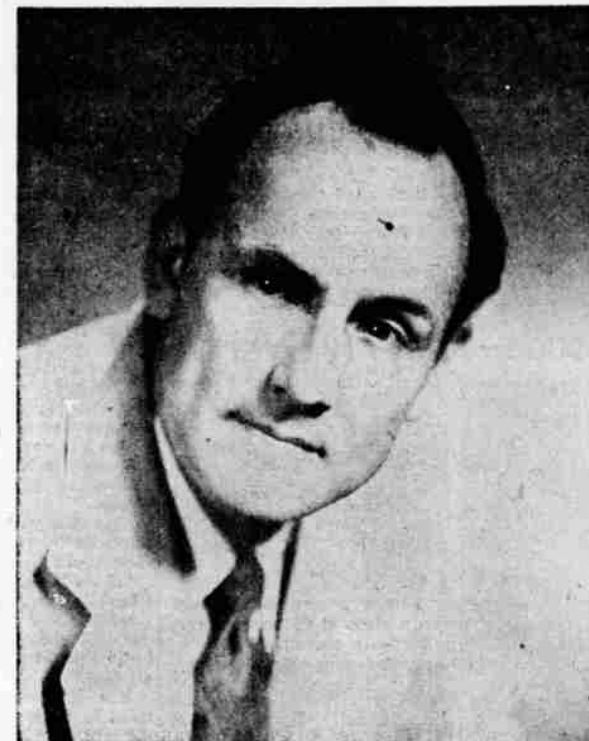
