

Jorys Offer S. Salem 30 Acre Park District

Salem Heights — Many issues of importance to the residents of the Liberty-Salem Heights area were discussed Wednesday evening as the new officers of the South Salem Suburban Chamber of Commerce took over their duties.

Taking office were, president, Don Gardner; vice-president, Myron Butler; secretary, Robert Friess; and treasurer, E. A. Bamford, Jr.

Directors are Chet French, for a five year term, and Fred Browning, Archie McKillop, Charles Shaw, and Harold Gardner, each serving a one year term.

The group accepted after the approval of the board of directors, an area of about 30 acres of land for a park south of Salem. The park to be deeded to the South Salem Suburban Chamber of Commerce.

It will be called Joryville Park, and was given by Mr. and Mrs. Edwin Jory. It has always been a dream of the Jorys to perpetuate the family name. The choice area is in the Jorys' holdings which were at one time 2460 acres.

The area consists of natural timber stand, natural park area with a creek and log bridge. A spring to serve as a water supply and the possibility of a swimming pool at a later date.

Near the log bridge are the picnic grounds and the possibility of development for recreational facilities.

The Jorys were made lifetime members of the Chamber of Commerce.

Hillsboro, (AP)—Paul Patterson, president of the Oregon senate, said Thursday Gov. Douglas McKay had given no indication in a telephone conversation when he would resign to accept a post as interior secretary.

"It is a wonderful thing for the state of Oregon that Eisenhower has selected Gov. McKay for his cabinet," Patterson said. "He will be able to do much for the state, for the entire Pacific Northwest and the Pacific Coast region. If he should resign the post of governor before Jan. 12, I would do my best to fulfill the duties of his office and to deliver the same excellent type of administration that McKay has provided."

If Patterson should succeed McKay as governor, the Washington county court would name a successor to fill Patterson's post in the coming legislative session.

Tooth Decay in Oregon High

Portland (AP)—Few states have a higher rate of tooth decay than Oregon, and the answer to this problem is to add fluorine to drinking water, the state dental health director said Tuesday.

There is no reasonable ground to oppose addition of fluorine to the water, he said, asserting that years of study have failed to show any injurious effect from it.

It does not affect taste either, he added. Witter compared it to adding a drop of water to keg of beer—too small to be noticeable.

These three representatives of American information media will be the only reportorial personnel attached to the Eisenhower party.

Hagerly said no press planes would be allowed to precede or follow Eisenhower on the Korean trip.

The reporter and two photographers will be chosen on a pool basis.

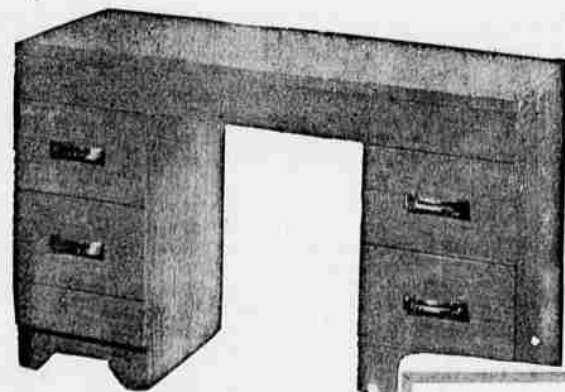
