

Rotary Clubs Aim for Peace

Rotary clubs in 83 countries throughout the world are united in an endeavor to promote international understanding, good will and peace. That was the message of Milan D. Smith of Pendleton, governor of District 154 of Rotary International, in addressing the Rotary club of Salem, Wednesday, following a conference with local Rotary officers, directors and committee chairmen.

In addition to the activities of Rotary's 7,600 clubs within their own communities to promote this objective, Mr. Smith explained, Rotary International has spent more than \$1,000,000 in recent years through its program of student fellowships, which enable outstanding college graduates to study for one year in countries other than their own, as ambassadors of good will. Since this program was established in 1947, 394 Rotary Fellowships have been awarded to students in 48 countries.

Since 1948 three Rotary Fellows have been selected from District 154. One used his scholarship to study in Switzerland; another in New Zealand; and the third is now studying in the Malay states.

"With fellowship and service to others as its keynote, Rotary provides a common ground for 380,000 business and professional executives throughout the world, regardless of differing nationalities or political or religious beliefs," the Rotary District Governor emphasized.

The governor stated that not only was substantial progress being made along the line of International Service, which is only one of the four avenues of service under the object of Rotary, but that he was well pleased with activity of the forty-four clubs of his district in connection with club, vocational and community service. He urged each Rotarian to ever be conscious in his personal, business and civic life that the object of Rotary is to foster and encourage the ideal of service as a basis of worthy enterprise.
