



Washington U.B.—A successful blockade of China would cut off an estimated 30 to 40 per cent of its imports, U. S. officials said today.

The bulk of these imports, however, are considered neither strategic nor essential to China's domesic economy. For that reason, these experts feel that a blockade in itself could not force Communist China to pull her troops out of Korea.

Furthermore, observers said, a blockade probably would have the effect of driving the Communist closer to Russia because they would then have to rely more heavily on overland transport to get supplies now arriving by sea.
