Ingredients: One 15-ounce can condensed milk, 1/4 teaspoon salt, 2 tablespoons molasses, 2 tablespoons corn syrup, 1/4 teaspoon vanilla, 2 cups finely crushed graham cracker crumbs, 1 cup chopped walnuts.

Method: Put condensed milk in mixing bowl and add salt, molasses, corn syrup and vanilla; stir until blended. Add graham cracker crumbs and walnuts; stir well. Grease a 9-inch pan; line bottom with waxed paper; grease paper. Turn graham cracker mixture into pan; bake in a moderate (350 deg.) oven 45 minutes. Run a spatula or small knife around sides of pan and turn out at once on cake rack; strip off paper immediately. Cool; while still warm place on board and cut into 24 bars.
