

# Vikings Tie Albany for Top Spot

## Haukmen Win, 57-48; Salem Goes to Eugene Friday

The Salem Vikings moved in to tie with the Albany Bulldogs here Tuesday night for the Big Six League lead as they outgained the Bulldogs 57-48.

Harold Hauk's Vikings took an early lead and then held it the rest of the way. When the going got rough they promptly got hot and took a larger lead.

Salem's early lead came as a result of four points by Dave Johnson and a field goal by Jim Knapp which gave the Vikings a 6-3 lead midway in the first period. Jack Cobb, Knapp, and Johnson all added a field goal apiece in the final half of the first quarter to give the Vikings a 12-3 margin over the Bulldogs at the end of the first period.

Neil Causbie scored all six of the Albany team's points in the first period. Albany is coached by Lee Cardon.

Salem jumped its lead to 20-10 with six minutes left in the half. Causbie poured in five more points in the last of the second period while Dave Shelby was getting three to trim the Viking's lead down to five points. The score at halftime was 23-10.

Causbie was the top scorer for the Bulldogs in the first half as he sank five field goals and three free throws for 13 points. Jack Cobb had eight in the first half for the Vikings while Dave Johnson and Jack Bishop were each hitting the hoop for seven points.

Early in the second half the Bulldogs narrowed the Salem lead but the Vikings quickly bounced back to take a 38-32 lead. Jack Bishop and Jack Cobb led the Vikings' attack in the first five minutes of the half.

Dean Sorenson put Albany back into the game with several quick field goals. Albany had narrowed Salem's once large lead down to 41-39 at the end of the third period. Harold Pontius was the top scorer for the Bulldogs in the third period with eight points.

Jack Cobb in two quick shots from the floor in the opening two minutes of the final quarter to give Salem a 45-39 lead. Tom Pickens and Bob Miller added a field goal apiece to give the Vikings a 49-32 lead with three minutes and 25 seconds remaining in the contest.

Albany narrowed the Salem lead down to striking distance in the last minutes but Bob Miller kept the Vikings ahead with

two timely field goals. The Vikings outscored the Bulldogs in the last period 16 to 9 to give them their 57-48 win.

Jack Cobb was the individual star of the game as he poured in six shots from the floor and five free throws for a total of 17 points. Albany's tall center, Neil Causbie, was right behind Cobb with 15 points.

Jack Bishop had 15 for the winning Vikings and Harold Pontius had 13 for the losers. Jim Knapp, although he scored only four points, kept the Salemites in the game with his ball stealing and passing.

Harold Hauk's Salem team now has a six won three lost record in league play. Their wins were over Springfield, Corvallis, Eugene, Bend twice, and finally Albany. Their losses in loop play were to Corvallis, Springfield and Albany.

Salem travels to Eugene Saturday night for a contest with

the up and coming Eugene Azmen at McArthur Court. It was Eugene who gave the Bulldogs their second league loss of the season last week-end. Eugene also has an upset win over the Marshfield Pirates to their credit.

In the past 12 years Salem has won seven Big Six titles and tied for two championships. Their other three years they finished in second place. In the years 1942 and 1952 the Vikings swept through league play under Coach Hank without a single loss.

In the preliminary last night the Albany junior varsity came through with a thrilling 49-47 victory over Lee Gustafson's Salem high sophomores. Albany won the game in the last three seconds as Ray Derrah sank two free shots after he was fouled by Curt Jantze.

Albany led in the first game

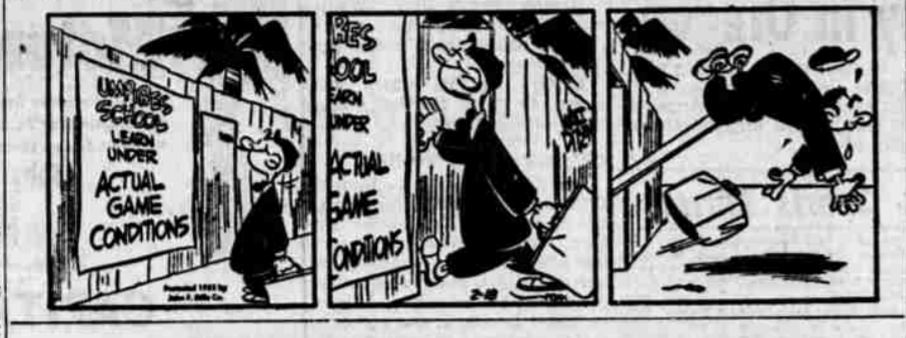
most of the way but the Salem team went ahead with two minutes remaining in the game. From then on it was a seesaw battle.

The scores at the quarters were 16-8 at the end of the opening period, 30-27 also for Albany at half, and it was tied 41 all going into the final period.

# Kansas Jayhawks in Easy Reach of Big Seven Title

The Big Seven Conference basketball championship is now "tailor made" for Flag Allen's fantastic Kansas Jayhawks.

That's what rival Coach Jack Gardner said Tuesday night after Kansas stretched its conference lead to two games over Kansas State by upsetting K-State, 80-78, before 13,500 at Manhattan.

Kansas, a six-point underdog, handed Kansas State its first home loss in 23 games. The furious battle left Allen's Jayhawks, defending conference and NCAA champions, with a 7-3 league record compared to 4-3 for Kansas State, the nation's No. 5 team.

Kansas, voted No. 10 nationally, has only three league games remaining.

North Carolina State regained place in the close Southern Conference race by swamping Washington and Lee, 108-60. Yale moved into a third place tie with Cornell in the Ivy League by beating the Big Red, 58-47.

Wichita continued its spell-rhyme in the Missouri Valley Conference by taking Tulsa, 81-70. In the Southwest Conference Texas Christian moved into a tie with Texas for the lead by beating Southern Methodist, 53-48.

Idaho edged Washington State 72-69, in the Pacific Coast Conference Northern Division. In the Border Conference Texas Tech downed Arizona, 100-80. Western Kentucky, which accepted a bid to NIT Tuesday, walloped Middle Tennessee, 95-57.

# Eddie Urmess Passes Army Physical Exam

The Dallas (AP)—Eddie Urmess, signed by the Boston Red Sox last year for a bonus reported variously at \$50,000 to \$85,000, has passed his physical examination and is awaiting induction into the Army.

If he is not called before April 2, he is to report for spring training at Santa Cruz, Calif. The Sox have optioned him to San Jose, in a California league.

# Phillies Turn To Rookie List

Philadelphia (AP)—The Philadelphia Phillies, seeking to recapture the National League pennant they won in 1950, turned to their list of rookies Wednesday in search of a front-line pitcher and a long-ball hitting outfielder.

The Phils, fresh from trading regular starter Russ Meyer for distance hitting first-baseman Earl Torgeson, are fairly well off with a mound staff built around Robin Roberts and Curt Simmons. But it would amount almost to pennant insurance to come up with another starter and an outfielder with power.
