### County Will Dismiss Suit

Oregon City U.P. — Attorney A. W. Lafferty today said a motion had been filed to dismiss action in a suit by Clackamas county in the U.S. district court to force distribution of \$8,000,000 accumulated from 472,000 acres of converted O & C lands in Oregon.

Lafferty said the district court has given the county until March 30 to file a brief in answer. He said the dismissal motion had been filed in the name of Secretary of Interior Douglas McKay and Secretary of Agriculture Ezra Benson.

Lafferty said the motion was based on the contention that the complaint does not state a claim upon which relief can be granted, the suit is against the United States when non-consent has been given for it to be used and the United States is a necessary party and has not been made a party.

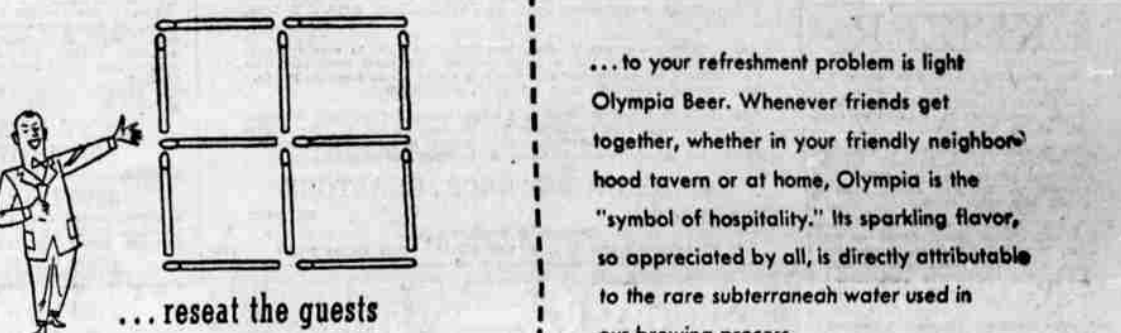
