## Cougar Hunters Fail to Return

Lebanon—Two cougar hunters were reported missing Monday morning by the wife of one of them, but Deputy Sheriff Wade Collins said he believes the men are voluntarily staying in the hills because of heavy storm.

Missing are George Hazen, Rt. 1, and William Patesch, Rt. 3, both of Lebanon.

Mrs. Hazen informed Lebanon police Monday morning the two men had gone cougar hunting early Sunday, planning to return at nightfall. They still had not returned Monday morning, and a snow storm has blanketed the area.

Collins said he had contacted Gene Patsch, brother of the other missing hunter, and had been told the men were probably all right and are following a cougar trail. There are numerous tracks in the area, he told the deputy sheriff.

The Patsch brothers often hunt the area and sometimes come out a long way from where they enter the hills to begin the hunt, the deputy was told.
