Washington (AP)—The FBI's list of "10 most wanted men," was revised again Wednesday to include a chronic jail-breaker, Percie Miller, 31, one-time soldier from Wayland, Mass.

Miller goes on the "most wanted" list as a replacement for Joseph James Brletic, wanted for a series of holdups in Pennsylvania and Missouri. Brletic was caught at Lancaster, Calif., Feb. 10, less than 24 hours after being placed on the FBI's list of top fugitives.

### "Voice" Row Pleases Reds

Washington (AP)—The Communist bloc has begun to chortle over the troubles of the "Voice of America."

The "Voice" itself has not been broadcasting anything about the inquiry into its operations by a senate committee headed by Sen. McCarthy, R-Wis. A spokesman said the State Department radio "never carries anything about itself—pro or con."

The Warsaw radio, in a Polish domestic broadcast recorded by U. S. government monitors, said that the most damaging testimony before the McCarthy committee was that the "Voice" was ineffective abroad.

This is what has stirred the "indignation of the infamous McCarthy," said Warsaw. It referred to the "Voice" staff as "a criminal gang gathered for spreading hatred and crime."

### Vigilantes in Movie Row

Silver City, N. M. (AP)—Peace officers tensed as a new threat of violence arose today over the controversial movie, "Salt of the Earth," being filmed in this Southwest New Mexico mining area.

State police were alerted after Sheriff Owen Matthews reported 150 townsmen at nearby Central had decided to warn makers of the film to "get out by noon or go out in black boxes."

The sheriff notified State Police Chief Joe Roach in Santa Fe that a 10-man committee had been appointed at the meeting to deliver the ultimatum to the movie makers, who have been accused in Congress of making the film under communist auspices.

Matthews asked that state police reinforcements be sent to back up local officers. Roach answered that he would have 30 to 40 officers on hand in the area before the noon deadline, and he would be heading them. The El Paso, Tex. Times said
