As expected, a loaded gun bill has been introduced in the legislature. The effect of th bill, if passed, would be to prohibit carrying a rifle or shetgun with live ammunition in the magazine, in cars or other conveyances on public roads or highways. "Conveyances" is a term general enough to include horses, bicycles, wagons, etc., as well as cars. The existing law defines a loaded gun as one having live ammunition in the breach. The new law would alter the definition, so that no ammunition could be carried in the weapon in any manner. Offhand, there seems little that is objectionable in the bill. We think that few people of good sense would carry a loaded gun in their cars in the first place. However, there will be opposition to the bill, more on principle than on the merits of this specific measure. One of the traditional rights of Americans has been to bear arms, and opponents of the bill will state that this is just another step in the direction of forcing citizens to register their sporting weapons. This bill, of course, goes nowhere near that far, and we feel
