Claim Father Caused Son to Kill Mother
Modesto, Calif. (AP)—A 58-year-old Modesto man denied today he talked his teenage son into killing the boy's mother, in what police called "the worst case of premeditated murder ever seen in this area."

The youth, 13-year-old Clarence Eugene Simpson, told police yesterday he had shot his mother, Mrs. Vivian Simpson, 43, in the chest with a .22 caliber rifle as she stepped from the back door of the family home last Tuesday.

Undersheriff Cecil Kilroy said the father, Henry Simpson, "kept telling Clarence his half-brothers were turning his mother against him and that his mother might even kill him."
