

Lady Molly Huggins Not Pessimistic in Address 6 Nominated By K&F Club

Lady Molly Huggins, born in Singapore married in Malaya, and wife of Sir John Huggins, former governor of Jamaica, did not answer her own propounded question of "Shall Slav, Anglo-Saxon, Latin, Oriental or African Inherit the Earth," while addressing the Salem Knife and Fork club Tuesday night at the Marion.

"Trade and not aid" is becoming a popular slogan in England, said Lady Molly, and she painted a picture of a general improvement in her home country.

The question of the colored races is one that must be solved when the matter of world peace is considered, believes Lady Molly. She pointed to the tremendous populations of Asia and Africa and said they must be brought into the folds of the democracies if communism is to be held in check.

That the battle against communism in Malaya is being won, was another assertion of the vivacious speaker. She quoted an authority on the subject who predicted that the fighting in Malaya would be concluded by the end of the year.

As for South Africa, Lady Molly said there was hope that a change in top governmental circles there would result in a more peaceful condition with resultant halt in the spread of communism.

The situation in the Caribbean is a good example of the successful cooperation of nationals, said Lady Molly. With a population in Jamaica about the same as that of Oregon, she said that there was no segregation of races. A person is judged by his character rather than by the pigmentation of the skin.

In closing Lady Molly stressed the importance of the people of the United States and Great Britain working together. "Each country should dwell upon the good points of the other," she added.

Going outside the field of world politics, Lady Molly spoke briefly concerning the approaching coronation of Queen Elizabeth whom she described as "much lovelier than her pictures," a person with tremendous character and dedicated to her country.

Judge Joseph B. Felton, Co-burn Grabenhorst, Bryan Goodenough, Carlton Greider, all of Salem, Lindsey Wright of Stayton, and W. J. Hunt of Woodburn were placed in nomination for two positions on the Salem Knife and Fork club Tuesday night.

The six men were selected by the nominating committee headed by Guy Hickok who presented them to the club membership during a dinner meeting at the Marion hotel.

President T. Harold Tomlinson, president of the club, urged the membership to vote as soon as they receive ballots by mail. One man will be selected from the Salem residents and one from the other two who represent the district outside of Salem.

Announcement of the results of the election will be made during the next dinner meeting scheduled for April 6 when Carveth Wells will be the speaker.

Sharp Drop Noted in Influenza Epidemic

The incidence of influenza dropped off sharply in Marion county during the seven-day period ended March 14, but there was a considerable increase in the number of cases of German measles.

The weekly report from the Marion county department of health concerning communicable diseases registered 53 cases of German measles, 48 of them being in state institutions. Influenza cases totaled 35, 11 of them in state institution, 8 in Salem and 16 over the balance of the county.

Other communicable and reportable diseases included: 9 measles, 4 chickenpox, 3 ringworm, 5 tuberculosis, and 1 each of conjunctivitis, impetigo, mumps, poliomyelitis and scarlet fever.

Sixty-one per cent of the available physicians reported.

2 Burglary Attempts Reported by Police

Two burglary attempts were reported by city police Monday — both apparently unsuccessful.

The front door of the Richfield service station at Kearney and South Commercial streets, was found sprung by an officer Saturday night after he saw two youths run from the area as he approached.

Some money in the cash register and a drawer was undisturbed and it was presumed that entry was not made.

A window pane over the door lock in the rear door was broken at Lehman's Seafoods store, 995 South Commercial street, sometime Saturday night, but the lock was still fastened and nothing was missing when the broken window was discovered so it was believed that entry was not made here either.
