

### Governor Signs Price Tag Bill

Governor Paul L. Patterson has signed a bill which provides that a price tag must be placed on any ballot measure, passage of which would result in the state losing revenue.

Two years ago the legislature passed a bill introduced by Rep. Henry Semon and the late Senator Carl Engdahl providing for price tags on revenue measures. It was the intent of the authors of the bill that the price tag should appear on measures that required

ed expenditure of funds or measures that would result in loss of revenue.

However, both the Marion county circuit court and the state supreme court held that the 1951 law did not cover loss of funds to the state. The bill signed by the governor corrects this omission and the price tag will now be required on both types of measures.

The bill was introduced by Rep. Semon and Senator Angus Gibson of Lane county.
