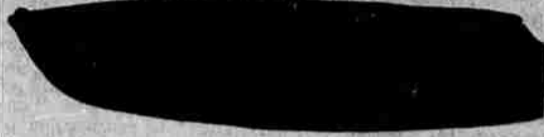

## Dallas Reports Crew Of Phoney Salesmen

Dallas—It is reported by the Dallas Chamber of Commerce that a team of salesmen wrongly representing themselves as representatives of a nationally advertised building supply company have been operating in Dallas. The salesmen operate on a house to house basis offering the household a "special introductory offer."

## Plan Refuges For Wild Fowl

Washington (AP)—California duck hunters and the Fish and Wildlife Service joined forces Wednesday in an effort to protect flights of migratory waterfowl.

They backed a bill before the House Interior Committee to authorize expenditure of \$830,000 on the Central Valley Reclamation Project to provide wildfowl management areas in the San Joaquin Valley.

Albert Day, Fish and Wildlife Service director, said the lands proposed to be flooded

with Central Valley Project water would be state and federally owned.

He told the committee it is hoped eventually to establish wildfowl management areas in the state totaling 27,000 acres.

Owners of private duck-hunting areas, who also are supporting the bill, said they are now buying water from the Central Valley Project at the cost of \$1.50 an acre foot, and would not receive any free government water under the bill which was introduced by Rep. Hunter (R., Calif.).
