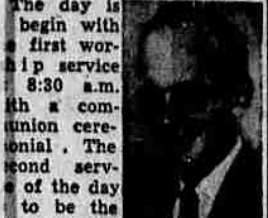


Silverton Methodists to Place Cornerstone Easter
